**Voices from the Past: A Walk through History**  
**--Reservations Suggested**

***Voices from the Past*** is an event that will provide a glimpse into some of the significant stories that make up the history of this, the oldest protected area of the National Park System. There will be stations with living history interpreters, and groups will walk from one to the other to hear what each has to say. You'll meet Caddo and Quapaw Indians, explorer Dr. George Hunter, early settler Hiram Whittington, and a host of others.

An American Sign Language Interpreter will be available.

Group size is limited; groups will start at 15 minute intervals. School groups are invited to come between 9:30 a.m. and 2 p.m.; call for a reservation. General public tours will begin at 5:30 p.m. with the last group beginning at 8:30 p.m. The tour will take about an hour and a half and is accessible. You will begin the tour at the first tent past the Superior Bathhouse at the Arlington Lawn area.

In the event of rain, this event will take place in the main building of the Hot Springs Rehabilitation Center.
