

HOT SPRINGS NATIONAL PARK QUARTER RELEASE
First of 56 coins in the America the Beautiful Quarters™ Program
April 20, 2010

Beginning in 2010, the United States Mint will issue 56 quarter-dollar coins featuring designs depicting national parks and other national sites as part of the United States Mint America the Beautiful Quarters™ Program.

Each year, the public will see five new national site designs depicted on the reverse (tails side) of America the Beautiful Quarters. The United States Mint will issue these quarters in the order in which the honored site was first established as a national site.



Hot Springs National Park was established by Congress as Hot Springs Reservation on April 20, 1832. President Andrew Jackson signed the enabling legislation to protect four square miles of land with the hot springs at the center. The name was changed to Hot Springs National Park by Congress on March 18, 1921.

People have used these hot springs for more than two hundred years to treat illnesses and to relax. Both rich and poor came for the baths, and a town built up around the Hot Springs Reservation to accommodate them. Together nicknamed "The American Spa," Hot Springs National Park today surrounds the north end of the city of Hot Springs, Arkansas.
