A WORKSHOP FOR TEACHERS OF GRADES 4-12

Celebrate Pennsylvania Archeology Month this October and learn about how archeology helps piece together the stories of the past.

Learn what archeology is and how we learn from what others have left behind. Participants will become archeologist as they participate in the *Archeology: History Found in Pieces* program, visit Franklin Court and hear how archeology was used to learn about Franklin and how it plays an important role in how we interpret Franklin today.

Teachers from Pennsylvania and New Jersey will earn three (3) professional development credit hours while taking an archeologist's look at Independence National Historical Park. Educators will learn about teaching with primary source documents and objects, discover how archeologists and curators use these clues to piece together history, and have the opportunity to explore Independence Park Institute's newly opened hands-on student learning labs.
