Expansion – spreading out or increasing in size

Territory – an area of land belonging to or used by a person or group of people

Proclamation – something that is announced or declared officially

Council – a group of people who advise another, such as a king or governor

Import – to bring in goods for sale from a foreign country

Smuggle – to bring in goods secretly, in violation of the law

Parliament – the lawmaking body of Great Britain, consisting of the House of Commons and the House of Lords

Currency – money, or something that is used as a medium of exchange

Merchant – a person who buys and sells goods

Legislature – the group of people who make the laws for a state or nation

Hostile – unfriendly behavior typical of an enemy

Barracks – a building for housing soldiers

Effigy – a dummy made to look like a person who is disliked (the dummy is often hanged and burned as a form of public protest)

Procession – walking or moving along in an orderly and formal manner, usually in a long line

Repeal – to revoke or withdraw officially

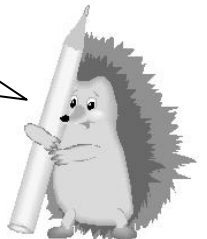

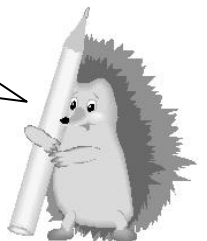

Unity – complete agreement among people in attitudes or opinions

Resolution – the solution of a problem or controversy **OR** a formal opinion or intention voted upon by a legislature or other group

Petition – a formal request, often signed by a number of people and addressed to a person in authority

Persuasive – appealing to reason and understanding to win a person over to a certain opinion or course of action

Mariner – a person who directs or assists in the navigation of a ship

Testimony – the statement of a witness, usually in court

Manslaughter – the killing of a human being by another, but unintentionally, as in an accident

Bankruptcy – being unable to pay your debts

Monopoly – total control over the sale of goods or services in a particular market

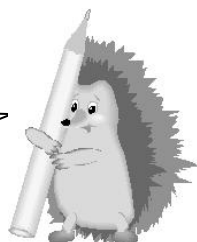
Delegate – a person assigned or elected to represent others

Pseudonym – a made up name used by an author to hide his or her identity

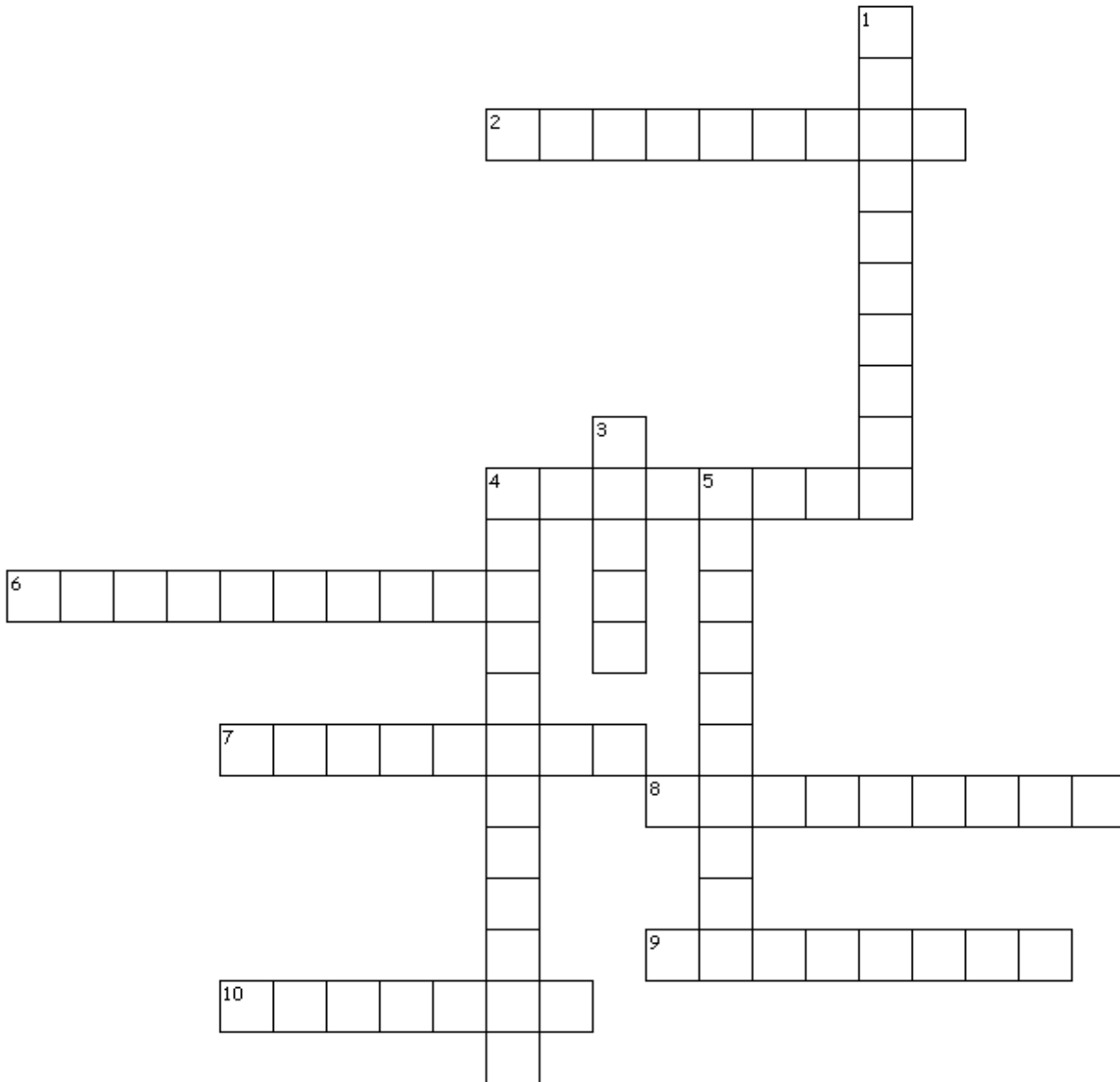

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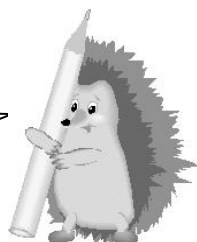
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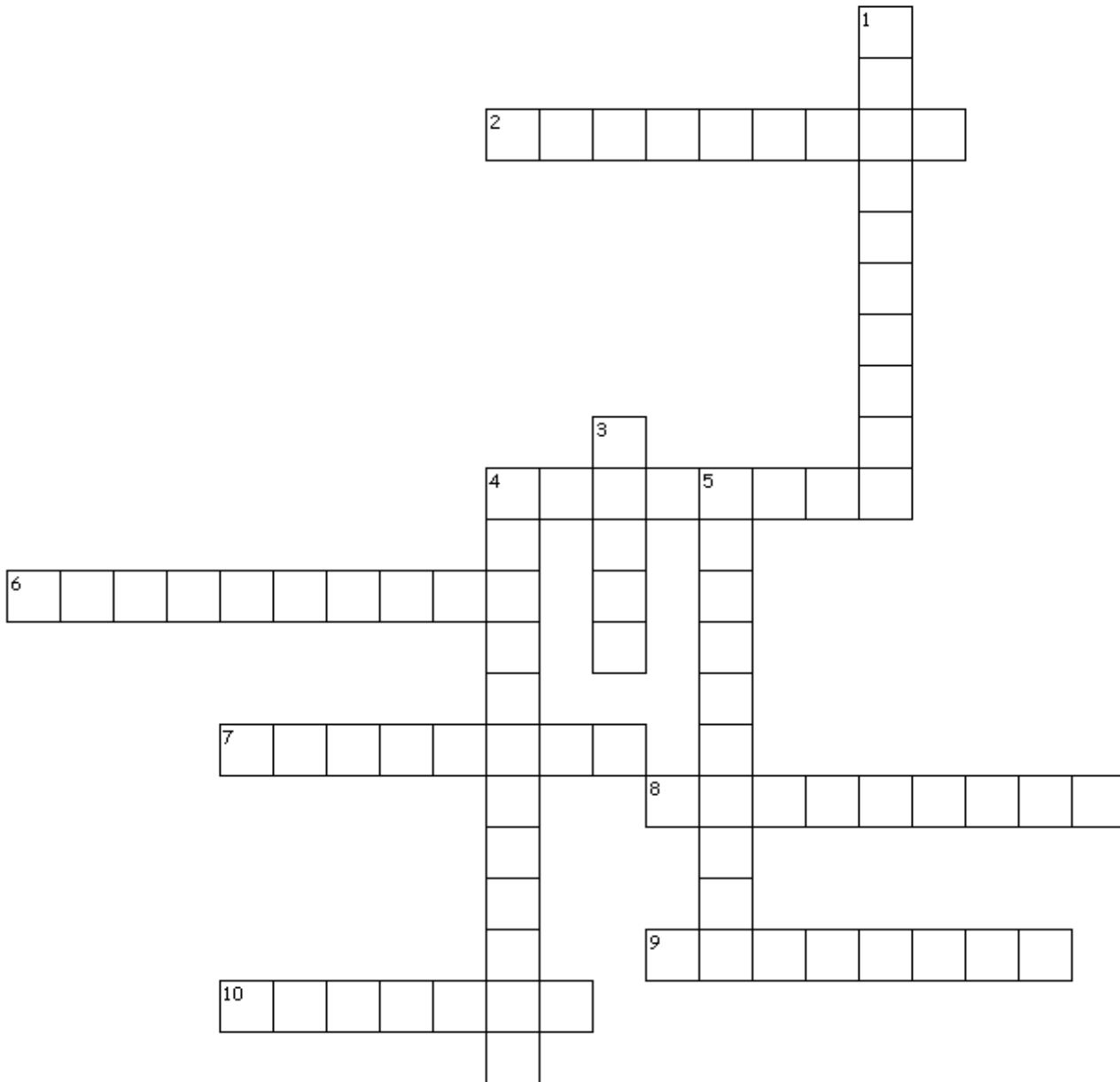

Retreat – the act of withdrawing into safety

Convene – to come together

Escalate – to increase in intensity

Reconciliation – the act of settling an argument peacefully

Resolution – a formal opinion or intention voted upon by a legislature or other group **OR** the solution of a problem or controversy

Proceedings – an activity, such as a meeting, that continues for some time

Pamphlet – a short essay or publication, often on a controversial subject and stitched together rather than bound

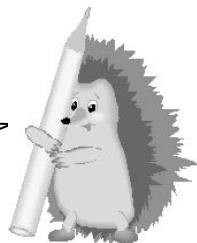
Musket - a smoothbore (not rifled) large caliber shoulder gun

Allegiance – the loyalty of a citizen to his or her government or king

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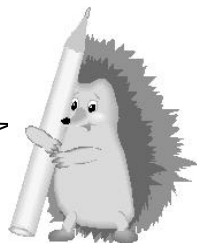

Confidential – secret or private

Drastic – extreme or severe

Unanimous – having the agreement of all

Abstain – to choose not to do something, such as vote

Fortnight – a period of fourteen days

Delete – to erase or cut out

Mercenaries – professional soldiers who are hired to fight with a foreign army

Preamble – the beginning part of a document, sometimes explaining why the document is necessary

Grievance – complaint or injustice

Unalienable – something that cannot be given away or taken away, such as the right to liberty (today we usually spell this word as “inalienable”).

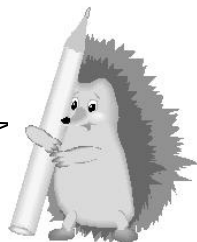
Engrossed – the handwritten text of an official document

Endowed – provided with something, such as a quality or gift

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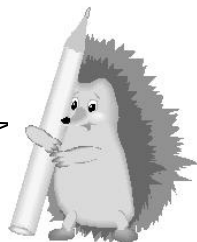

Hessian – a German soldier paid to fight with the British army in the Revolutionary War

Occupation – the seizure and control of an area by military forces

Surround – enclose on all sides or encircle

Huzzah – shout or joy or applause, like hooray

Encamp – to set up or live in a camp

Prussian – a person from Prussia, a kingdom in north central Europe (today it would be northern Germany and northern Poland)

Alliance – an agreement uniting nations in a common cause

Negotiate – to bring about through discussion and compromise

Indefinite – having no exact time limit

Traitor – a person who makes war against his or her own country

Deception – a trick, or pretending to believe in one cause while acting in favor of the opposite cause

Confederation – a group of states more or less permanently united

Diplomacy – conducting meetings between nations to bring about such things as treaties and trade agreements
