



Sand Bars

Stay out of the water when there are high breaking waves. If caught in a rip current, DON'T PANIC, swim parallel to the shore or float until you are free of the current, then swim back to the shore. Call for help if you see a struggling swimmer. When possible, swim in view of lifeguards.

**Remember:
White Waves Kill.**

Rip currents are powerful currents of water moving away from shore. They can sweep even the strongest swimmer out to sea.

IF CAUGHT IN A RIP CURRENT

- ◆ Don't fight the current
- ◆ Swim out of the current, then to shore
- ◆ If you can't escape, float or tread water
- ◆ If you need help, call or wave for assistance

SAFETY

- ◆ Know how to swim
- ◆ Never swim alone
- ◆ If in doubt, don't go out

The Lake


Name the five Great Lakes. (Here's a hint: Homes)
