INDIANA DUNES NATIONAL LAKESHORE

CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS Title 36, Chapter 1:

Compendium of Designations, Closures, Permit Requirements, and other Restrictions imposed under the discretionary authority of the Superintendent.

Under the provisions of 16 USC 3, and in accordance with the regulations and delegated authority provided in Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Chapter I, Parts 1-7, the following regulatory provisions are established for the proper management, protection, government and public use of Indiana Dunes National Lakeshore.

Unless otherwise stated, these regulatory provisions apply in addition to the requirements contained in 36 CFR, Chapter I. The attached amendment will become effective August 26, 2009 and will become part of the 2009 Superintendents Compendium

Consistent with applicable legislation and Federal administrative policies, the following information will be added as an amendment to the 2009 Superintendent's Compendium of regulations.

SECTION 2.51 PUBLIC ASSEMBLIES, MEETINGS

(e) The following areas are designated for public assemblies or meetings. Maps of these areas are available in the Office of the Superintendent, Office of the Chief Ranger and the Dorothy Buell Memorial Visitor Center and will be furnished upon request and/or with a permit.

- Chellberg Farm Area – The grassy area on the south side of the parking lot, east of the picnic shelters.
- West Beach Area – The sidewalk area adjacent to the contact station, north of the motorcycle parking lot.
- Park Headquarters – The grassy area north of the parking lot and west of the entrance sidewalk.
- Mt. Baldy – The grassy island in the center of the parking lot traffic circle

The use of these areas minimizes impacts to the natural and historic scene, to resources, and to activities and public enjoyment of the park.

This amendment will become effective August 26, 2009 and will become part of the 2009 Superintendents Compendium.
