




## Tolleston Dunes

*Formerly known as Inland Marsh*

This scenic trail leads over the high ridges of the Tolleston Dunes, formed about 10,000 years ago when Lake Michigan was 25 feet higher than it is today. Preserve Tolleston Dunes for future generations—do not walk off the trails, pick wildflowers, or disturb animal habitats.

The national lakeshore was established in 1966 to preserve for the educational, inspirational, and recreational use of the public, certain portions of the Indiana Dunes and other areas of scenic, scientific, and historic interest and recreational value in the state of Indiana. About two million annual visitors enjoy the park's 15,000 acres of wetlands, prairies, sand dunes, oak savannas, forests, and historic sites. 

## Water Safety

Lake Michigan waters can be hazardous. Rip currents occur frequently during periods of high wind and waves. During the winter, shelf ice forms along the lakeshore and is never safe to walk on. Check with local authorities about conditions and potential hazards.

Note: There are no lifeguards at any portion of the national lakeshore beach during the fall, winter, and spring.
