

Getting Around During Arch Grounds Improvements

Suggested Driving Routes to the Gateway Arch and Old Courthouse

Begin your journey to the Jefferson National Expansion Memorial at the Old Courthouse in the center of downtown St. Louis. It is located between Market and Chestnut streets, which run east-west, and 4th Street and Broadway, which run north-south.

Use this map to find preferred parking garages and lots, which are a short walk from the Old Courthouse and Gateway Arch. You can locate preferred parking online and with a mobile device at: www.GetAroundSTL.com.

- 1 FROM WEST:** Traveling east on I-64/40, take Exit #40 (6th Street Exit, last Missouri Exit). At the stoplight at the end of the ramp turn left on Gratiot Street. Go through one stoplight. At the second stoplight turn left on 4th Street. Continue north on 4th Street to the Old Courthouse on Market Street.
- 2 FROM WEST:** Traveling east on Market Street, the Old Courthouse is between Broadway and 4th Street.
- 3 FROM SOUTH:** Traveling on I-44 east or I-55 north, take Exit #291B to Walnut Street. Turn left on the Walnut Street Bridge. Turn right at 4th Street. The Old Courthouse will be on your left at Market Street.
- 4 FROM EAST:** Traveling west on I-64/55, cross the Poplar Street Bridge. Continue on I-64 West to Exit #40A (9th Street Exit). Continue straight off the exit on 9th Street to Market Street and turn right. The Old Courthouse is between Broadway and 4th Street on Market Street.
- 5 FROM EAST:** Traveling west on I-70, cross the Stan Musial Veterans Memorial Bridge then exit left to North Tucker Boulevard. Turn left on Washington Avenue. Turn right on Broadway. The Old Courthouse is between Chestnut Street and Market Street on Broadway.
- 6 FROM NORTH:** Traveling east on I-70, take the Tucker Blvd. Exit #249B and merge on North Tucker Boulevard. Turn left on Washington Avenue. Turn right on Broadway. The Old Courthouse is between Chestnut Street and Market Street on Broadway.

The Gateway Arch and Riverboats are open during construction! Advance tickets are highly recommended. For more information or to make a reservation, visit www.gatewayarch.com.

Park Over the Highway

The design starts with a new, dramatic park that will extend over I-44 between Chestnut and Market Streets and join the Arch grounds with the Old Courthouse, finally physically connecting St. Louis to its most famous landmark. It will allow visitors to walk from the Old Courthouse to the Arch grounds and to the riverfront on one continuous greenway, without a curb or stair step in their way.



North Gateway Park

The current Arch parking garage will be replaced with seven acres of usable park space for festivals, concerts, and community events. It will include a Lewis and Clark Explorers' Garden for children with a raised walkway featuring views of Eads Bridge and the Mississippi River. Washington Avenue will end at Memorial Drive allowing the park to expand directly to Eads Bridge and Leonor K. Sullivan Boulevard along the river.



Riverfront

Leonor K. Sullivan Boulevard will be elevated, reducing flooding occurrences that close the Riverfront during the year. This will provide pedestrians, bicyclists and vehicles access to a 1.5 mile promenade for activities and commerce between Biddle Street and Chouteau Avenue, with connections to existing bicycle trail networks.



A New Entrance to the Arch

A new glass entrance to the museum below the Arch will face the Park Over the Highway and the Old Courthouse and bring natural light underground to create a fitting terminus of the Gateway Mall. Museum exhibits will be redesigned to tell the story of Westward Expansion and St. Louis in new, interactive ways.

CityArchRiver 2015 is a transformational project that will physically connect the Arch to the city and river that surround it for the first time in the iconic landmark's history.
