Eastern newt	<i>Notophthalmus viridescens</i>	found in and near aquatic habitats
Southern dusky salamander	<i>Desmognathus auriculatus</i>	hardwood forests
Lesser siren	<i>Siren intermedia</i>	swamp, marsh
Northern cricket frog	<i>Acris crepitans</i>	all habitats
Gulf coast toad	<i>Bufo valliceps</i>	all habitats
Greenhouse frog	<i>Eleutherodactylus planirostris</i>	hardwood forests
Eastern narrowmouth toad	<i>Gastrophryne carolinensis</i>	all habitats
Bird-voiced treefrog	<i>Hyla avivoca</i>	hardwood forests, swamp
Green treefrog	<i>Hyla cinerea</i>	all habitats
Squirrel treefrog	<i>Hyla squirella</i>	swamp, hardwood forests
Spring peeper	<i>Pseudacris crucifer</i>	swamp, hardwood forests
Chorus frog	<i>Pseudacris triseriata</i>	hardwood forests, swamp
Bullfrog	<i>Rana catesbeiana</i>	hardwood forests, swamp
Bronze frog	<i>Rana clamitans</i>	all habitats
Pig frog	<i>Rana grylio</i>	marsh
Southern leopard frog	<i>Rana sphenoccephala</i>	swamp, marsh

Broad-headed skink	<i>Eumeces laticeps</i>	hardwood forests
Mediterranean gecko	<i>Hemidactylus turcicus</i>	buildings within hardwood forests
Ground skink	<i>Scincella lateralis</i>	all habitats
Copperhead	<i>Agkistrodon contortrix</i>	hardwood forests, higher ground in swamps

Cottonmouth	<i>Agkistrodon piscivorus</i>	all habitats
Racer	<i>Coluber constrictor</i>	all habitats
Pygmy rattlesnake	<i>Sistrurus miliarius</i>	hardwood forests
Canebrake rattlesnake	<i>Crotalus horridus</i>	hardwood forests
Rat snake	<i>Elaphe obsoleta</i>	all habitats
Mud snake	<i>Farancia abacura</i>	swamp, within ponds in the hardwood forests, and possibly marsh
Speckled kingsnake	<i>Lampropeltis getula</i>	all habitats
Louisiana milk snake	<i>Lampropeltis triangulum</i>	hardwood forests, swamp
Mississippi green water snake	<i>Nerodia cyclopion</i>	marsh
Yellowbellied water snake	<i>Nerodia erythrogaster</i>	hardwood forests
Banded water snake	<i>Nerodia fasciata</i>	all habitats
Diamondback water snake	<i>Nerodia rhombifer</i>	transition between marsh and swamp
Rough green snake	<i>Opheodrys aestivus</i>	all habitats
Graham's crayfish snake	<i>Regina grahamii</i>	hardwood forest, swamp
Glossy crayfish snake	<i>Regina rigida</i>	hardwood forests
Brown snake	<i>Storeria dekayi</i>	hardwood forests, swamp, marsh
Ring-necked snake	<i>Diadophis punctatus</i>	hardwood forests
Western ribbon snake	<i>Thamnophis proximus</i>	all habitats
Garter snake	<i>Thamnophis sirtalis</i>	hardwood forests
American alligator	<i>Alligator mississippiensis</i>	swamp, marsh
