


# Battle of New Orleans Bicentennial National Park Service Events Jean Lafitte National Historical Park and Preserve

Wednesday, January 7, at Jackson Square, New Orleans

Call to Arms 11:00 a.m. – Major General Andrew Jackson and his aide Edward Livingston review the troops and issue a call to arms. Join living history troops at Jackson Square for a reenactment of the December 18, 1814, event that rallied the city against an expected British invasion.

Thursday, January 8, at Chalmette Battlefield

9:00-10:30 a.m. Commemoration Ceremony – On the 200th anniversary of the Battle of New Orleans, pay tribute to those involved in the battle and its aftermath. Dignitaries, living history reenactors, and representatives of groups, organizations, service branches, and American Indian tribes that participated in the battle will attend. Speakers to be announced.

11:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. – Battlefield and visitor center open for self-guided tours and scheduled ceremonies by military units and living history groups.

4:00 p.m. – Tennessee War of 1812 Bicentennial Commission ceremony and retiring of colors.

Friday, January 9, at Chalmette Battlefield

9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. – Explore the human side of the Battle of New Orleans through self-guided tours, cannon and musket firings, and “Battle of New Orleans University” programs specially designed for school field trips (see website for school field trip registration information). Meet the troops of 1815 and the civilians who supported their efforts and discover the teamwork required for military success.

Saturday, January 10, at Chalmette Battlefield

10:00 a.m.-3:30 p.m. – Experience the historic events of 1815 through self-guided tours, cannon and musket firings, speakers, music, book signings, and “Battle of New Orleans University” programs.

3:30-5:00 p.m. – Reenactment of January 23, 1815, victory celebration.

All National Park Service events are free and open to the public. All public parking for all battlefield events Thursday-Saturday is at the St. Bernard Parish Government Complex/Frederick J. Sigur Civic Center in the 8200 block of West Judge Perez Drive, Chalmette. Free shuttle buses, including wheelchair-accessible buses, will provide transportation between the parking area and the battlefield.
