


# Junior Ranger Day

Take part in the special activities that have been designed for kids from 4 to 14 (and their parents too!) to celebrate National Park Week, National Junior Ranger Day, and Earthday.



## Activity Schedule

**11 a.m. — Build a Tortoise** (1 hour) Cottonwood rangers will display life-sized tortoise models and you will build your own tortoise. Meet at Cottonwood Visitor Center.

**11 a.m. & 2 p.m. — Ranger Stories & Songs** (1 hour) Ranger Don will sing songs and tell stories of the ranger life and our national parks. You can try on a ranger uniform and have your picture taken. Meet at the Joshua Tree Visitor Center.

**1 p.m. & 3 p.m. — The Coyote & the Roadrunner** (1 hour) Learn the real story behind the coyote and the roadrunner. Rangers Dylan and Claudia will teach you to howl like a coyote. Draw your own coyote and create your own coyote story. Meet at the Oasis Visitor Center.

**2 p.m. — The Joshua Tree, Life in a High Rise** (1 hour) Learn about the animals that make the Joshua tree their home. Color your Joshua tree apartment, make a yucca moth, and help Ranger Bret measure a Joshua tree. Meet at Cap Rock Nature Trail

**All Day — Desert Quests** Pick up a quest map at a visitor center, then follow a quest trail and mark the things you discover on your map. Afterwards, stop at a visitor center and show your map to a ranger.
