### **IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Moved by Raasio and seconded by Jenich to approve the minutes of the October 24, 2006 meeting.

Motion carried unanimously. (6/0)

### **V. BUSINESS**

#### **1. PARK REPORTS:**

##### **a) ANDREW FERGUSON, Acting Park Superintendent**

- 1) Expressed his gratitude for being able to work with KNHPAC and admiration for it as a resource and commended the staff.**

##### **b) TOM BAKER, Management Assistant**

- 1) Welcomed Mr. Ferguson, who is here on a 60-day detail.**
- 2) Vacated Headquarters facilities on Red Jacket in preparation for the interior rehab. Are now located on the second floor of the Merchant and Miners Building on Fifth and Portland. Main park telephone number is the same, but the Museum Services number is 337-1207.**
- 3) Interior rehabilitation is proceeding with demo 75 to 80% finished. A small, previously unknown fireplace was uncovered.**
- 4) Budget: federal government has Keweenaw NHP on a continuing resolution, which means that they will be working from last year's budget and it's likely that it will continue through the entire year. It's looking less and less likely that congress will pass a budget this year.**

c) **KATHLEEN HARTER, Chief of Interpretation and Education (see index 1)**

- 1) **PMIS submissions** a few new ones for education and updated the park handbook.
- 2) **District Statistics** were handed out. Statistics for the seasonal interpretive programs doubled from the previous year.
- 3) **AC Minutes** are now posted on the website.
- 4) **Color Map of the Calumet Unit** was handed out and is on the site.
- 5) **Junior Ranger April 28** has been designated as National Junior Ranger day and parks are doing events for the day.
- 6) **Copper Country Intermediate School District** is writing a NEH grant for teacher workshops that focus on the park and local history, with teachers coming from all over the country.
- 7) **Isle Royale Natural History Association** voted to keep Keweenaw NHP at their October board meeting. They have agreed to a new name – Isle Royale and Keweenaw Parks Association, with the name change occurring in 2007. New Board member: Arnie Alanen.
- 8) **National Park Foundation Final Report** completed for the Junior Ranger Ambassador Program. Finlandia University is doing the design and layout and Julie Dlubala with the CLK is working on the book.
- 9) **Annual Servicewide Interpretive Report and Annual Volunteer Management Report** completed.
- 10) **Unigrd** should be ready by this summer season.
- 11) **Junior Ranger Book Development** target completion mid-April.
- 12) **Passport Stamps** are an upcoming challenge. New stamps cost \$50 apiece to be developed and 19 sites makes them \$950. Inserts are an option, too. The book just does not accommodate all the sites.

d) **BRIAN HODUSKI, Museum, Archives, and Historical Services**

- 1) **Fire suppression system** is completed in the Library and is charged and operational.
- 2) **Collections work** ongoing. New collections in the repository include Greenland Township records, Calumet Township.
- 3) **Reference Services** reading room is now open and has serviced sixty research requests so far (since October).
- 4) **Oral Histories:** Jo Urion is collecting more oral history interviews this year.
- 5) **Local History Smackdown** in April at the Calumet Theater. Heritage Sites are invited to set up info tables.

e) **STEVE DELONG, Landscape Architect – Preservation Services Division**

- 1) **Heritage Sites Committee**

- 2) **CLR** is now in the draft state and is now being reviewed by the regional office. Jo Urion has helped a lot.
- 3) **Servicewide Comprehensive Call** in this round the signage project was updated to include wayfinding signs for Heritage Sites, gateway entrance signs, and land acquisition for placement of signs. Total project cost of around \$220,000.
- 4) **Western UP Planning and Development** using aerial data for their GIS system.
- 5) **Copper Country National Byway** met to review interpretive planning.
- 6) **Agreements Technical Representative Training** attended in Bayfield, WI; background and requirements for working in partnership and agreement relationships with the Park Service.
- 7) **CLK** signage at their entrance on Red Jacket Road.
- 8) **MTU Seaman Mineral Museum** dialog about a work plan and review process progressing steadily.
- 9) **Main Street Design Committee**
- 10) **Provided** assistance to interpretive division with maps for the Unigrd.

f) **JOHN ROSEMURGY, Historical Architect**

- 1) **Headquarters demo** should be ready by Mid-February for a walk-through. Then Park Service will review bids and hopefully make an award in April. Project should be completed (conservatively) within nine months to a year.
- 2) **Boiler Installation** for Union Building has been funded and construction documents will be initiated, and then a contractor will be secured.
- 3) **C & H Warehouse No. 1** rehabilitation of fire suppression system has been funded there.
- 4) **Re-Roofing Quincy Mine Office** for '07.
- 5) **Partner Projects WUPPDR/Calumet Township**; triplex building located on Waterworks Street. SHPO is listing the property for resale. \$25,000 loan is available for stabilization for property owners.
- 6) **MSHDA** providing \$15,000 façade improvements on the 400 block of Fifth Street, and is being expanded to include the 400 block of Sixth Street.
- 7) **Calumet Village Historic District Commission** has approved the design guidelines and they will be coming out soon. Bill Rosemurgy appointed as HCD Coordinator.
- 8) **Quincy Stone Masonry KNHP** has tentatively approved stabilization funding in '08 for three sets of ruins along US 41.

2. COMMISSION REPORTS

- a) **BUDGET** Sue Cone handed out the year-end summary of revenues and expenses and individual breakdowns. (See Index 2)

Moved by Raasio and seconded by Jenich to approve the payment of January bills.

Motion carried unanimously. (6/0)

- 1) **Donation of Property:** the Mesnard Streetcar Station, the one island not owned by the Park Service in the midst of its 104-acre parcel. Mrs. Sandra Carstens is donating the property to the Advisory Commission. Baker presented the signed quit-claim deed to the Commission.

Moved by Johnson, seconded by Raasio to accept the property.

Albee included in the motion "...with gratitude to the donor." Jenich added, "and with the understanding that the National Park Service will be in charge of all its maintenance and all costs until the Park officially takes ownership. I further move that we convey the Mesnard Streetcar Station Property to the Keweenaw National Historical Park as soon as they are able to accept it."

Motion carried unanimously. (6/0)

Moved by Albee, seconded by Cone to turn the property over to the Keweenaw National Historical Park as soon as they are able to accept it with the understanding that the National Park Service will be in charge of all of its maintenance and costs.

Motion carried unanimously. (6/0)

- 2) **Funding:** statutory funding will have to be reintroduced and gone through again – no funding for FY '07. Senator Levin has introduced the legislation to remove the matching requirement for the Commission's funding; raise ceilings on appropriations; remove the prohibition on the Park Service's acquisition of contaminated sites.

**b) PARTNERSHIP COMMITTEE**

- 1) **Initiation of Heritage Sites:** The Partnership Committee recommended that nineteen sites be designated as Keweenaw Heritage Sites to work in partnership with the park. (See Index 3 for complete list)

Moved by Johnson, seconded by Raasio that the Commission accept the Partnership Committee's recommendation that those listed become Keweenaw Heritage Sites.

Motion carried unanimously. (6/0)

Ceremonial certificates were passed out to all the Keweenaw Heritage Sites in attendance and, as they shook hands with Andy Ferguson and Kim Hoagland, they were photographed.

c) **GRANTS COMMITTEE**

- 1) Met to discuss and cover responsibilities, listed:
  - Status of Cooperating Agreements between Park and Keweenaw Heritage Sites
  - Ability to get funds, staff
  - Securing sources of funding
  - Meet with new superintendent

d) **COMMISSIONER'S REPORTS**

- 1) **Raasio** – thanked the Park Service personnel and Commission members who helped to finalize the Keweenaw Heritage Sites. Franklin-Quincy Fire Department is continuing to look at relocation.
- 2) **Cone** – thanked the Calumet Theatre for the use of the ballroom for Frank Fiala's retirement reception and Sandy Huuki, Eva Szilagyi, and Lucy Nakkula for their help at the reception. The Merchant and Miner's elevator and sidewalk project is being finished; Oak Street infrastructure will continue next spring, summer. A \$35,000 MCAC grant was received for the Calumet Theatre. The project includes a \$35,000 match. MSHDA has another façade grant program and signature buildings grant program which the Village may apply for.
- 3) **Albee** – thanked Clyde for chairing the Partnership Committee; thanked Hoduski, DeLong and Baker for their efforts with the Partnership Committee.
- 4) **Jenich** – expressed his gratitude to Mrs. Carstens for her donation of land.
- 5) **Johnson** - thanked the Keweenaw Heritage Sites for their individual efforts.
- 6) **Hoagland** –
  - **Scott See, student at MTU**, studied other partnership parks, advisory commissions, and partnership sites and produced a comparative analysis which will be published on the park website. Will be interviewing Keweenaw Heritage Sites this spring.
  - **Mason Historic District Nomination** hearing with the state review board postponed, but will go on to the April agenda.
  - **Lake Linden National Register Nomination** being worked on.
  - **Key Ingredients** proceeding. Currently an ethnic recipe contest in which children submit family recipes. The exhibit is coming this summer.

## VI. REPORTS/COMMENTS FROM LEGISLATIVE STAFF

1. **Amy Wisti, Congressman Stupak's office:** Welcomed Andy Ferguson. Funding February through September of this fiscal year is stop gap, then they will be budgeting for '08.

## VII. COMMENTS/QUESTIONS FROM THE PUBLIC

1. **Ed Yarbrough, Quincy Mine Hoist Association:** Open for the first winter this year. Thanked Bruce Keiskola, Rosemurgy and DeLong for finalizing a grant for the roundhouse stabilization, which will enable the recovery of the Quincy Locomotive from the East Coast. Concurrent Key Ingredients satellite exhibit, the kitchen of a miner's house, in conjunction with MTU class.
2. **Jean Ellis, Chairperson for the Gathering of Cornish Cousins** in week of July 25 - 29. 300 people have already registered. Invites Heritage Sites to set up a table at the registration.
3. **Jim Lowell, Calumet Theater:** reached funding goals for the new stage curtain and they plan to have it up before summer; also fundraising matching funding for the bricks and mortar work on the building.
4. **Nancy Leonard, Chassell Historical Organization:** participating in Key Ingredients exhibit – hosting a Fourth Thursday in July that features strawberry farmers and taste-testing. Friends of Fashion will put on a show during Strawberry Festival. Friends of Fashion will also host a tea at the Laurium Manor Inn in July.
5. **Jim LaMuth, Western UP Development:** working on second phase for the Copper Country Historical Scenic Trails and byways signage.
6. **Jean Pemberton, Copper Range Historical Society:** signage is an issue with the road change; finalized an interpretive sign with the Western UP Heritage Trail Network.
7. **Bruce Johanson, Ontonagon County Historical Society:** thanked Museums for America internship program 2008; will host UP Historical Conference in Silver City June 22 – 24, 2007.
8. **Dick Dana, Coppertown Mining Museum:** Rastello Shoe Shop equipment exhibit will be featured. Stuart Baird and Joseph Mihal are recreating the shoe shop and there will be a special dedication.

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## Keweenaw NHP - January 23, 2007 Interpretation & Education Update

### PMIS Update:

1. Completed five PMIS submissions and updated two other statements.
  - FY 2008 Create Education Steering Committee – requesting \$5,700.00.
  - FY 2008 Create Park Handbook for Visitors – requesting \$141,091.00.
  - FY 2008 Fund Seasonal Staff at Quincy Visitor Information Desk – requested through FY2013.
  - FY 2008 Fund Volunteer Program – requested through FY2013.
  - FY 2008 Provide Interpretive Exhibits and Furnishings for Park HQ – requesting \$246,943.00.
  - FY 2011 Create Virtual Education Curriculum for KNHP – requesting \$55,000.00.
  - FY 2010 Create Interior Interpretive Exhibits in former C&H Payshed – requesting \$492,600.00.

### Outside Organizations and Events:

2. Currently assisting the CCISD (Copper Country Intermediate School District) with the submission of an NEH (National Endowment for the Humanities) grant for 2008. The grant is for a series of teacher workshops that focus on the park and local history.
3. April 28, 2007 has been designated as National Junior Ranger day by the Washington Office. A local event is being coordinated by Kathleen with assistance from two CLK educators.
4. Continued involvement in the Key Ingredients event slated for July and August of 2007.
5. Copper Country Scenic Byway - Steve and Kathleen are involved with the Interpretation Committee and the review of grant submissions.
6. Isle Royale Natural History Association voted to retain Keweenaw NHP at their October board meeting. They also have a new board member – Arnie Arnanen. The board has also agreed to a new name – Isle Royale and Keweenaw Parks Association. The name change will occur in 2007 once all members have received notice.

### Reports:

7. Completed and submitted the National Park Foundation final report for the Junior Ranger Ambassador Program. While the project is still underway, the final report was due in December. This project has resulted in the park's first Junior Ranger book –something that could not have been accomplished without the aid and assistance of the National Park Foundation, Ocean Spray, and the Student Conservation Association - see attached document.
8. Completed the Annual Service-wide Interpretive Report.
9. Completed the Annual Volunteer Management Report.
10. 2006 Visitor Statistics for KEWE and Keweenaw Heritage Sites – see attached

### Media Update:

11. Web update
  - a. All Advisory Commission meeting minutes are on the web (dating back to 1995).
  - b. Calumet Unit map created by Dan with Steve's input and assistance.
  - c. Continual updating and maintenance on a recurring basis.

12. Park Unigrid
  - a. Text was finalized after many revisions and conference calls with Harpers Ferry.
  - b. The park is still awaiting review of the maps (peninsula and two unit maps). This is supposed to arrive sometime in January.
  - c. The park must also provide one more review of the entire document before it goes to print.
  - d. The park anticipates receiving the finished product in time for the summer season.
13. Junior Ranger Book Development
  - a. Text and illustrations are being finalized.
  - b. A publication class from Finlandia University will be doing the design. This is being done for two reasons; lack of NPS staff time and funds and to provide local university students with real life media experience.
  - c. Once complete, the book will be available free of charge to all park visitors.
  - d. Target completion and distribution date is mid-April.
14. Work will continue on the Calumet self-guided walking tour brochure later this winter.
15. Dan created the new 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday in History poster – see attached.
16. Research and text is being done for the creation of a pasty site bulletin by park volunteer Valerie Newman. Design and layout will be completed by Dan and Valerie. The bulletin will be ready for the summer season and the Key Ingredients exhibit.
17. 2007 Summer Newspaper
  - a. Articles are being written by each park division
  - b. Design and layout is being worked on by Dan.
  - c. Questions have arisen regarding the design and printing of the centerfold map – this must still be resolved.
  - d. Target printing and delivery is late April-early May.

**Miscellaneous Activities:**

18. The seasonal hiring announcement for interpretation was posted on USAJobs from December 22, 2006 – January 19, 2007. Budget is questionable regarding the length of the seasonal positions and their grade.
19. Kathleen attended ATR (Agreements Technical Representative) Training December 4-8, 2006. The training was crucial in understanding the policies and guidelines regarding Cooperative Agreements, Memorandums of Understanding, Grants, and Awards. Steve DeLong, Betsy Rossini, and Pam Griffin also attended.
20. Interpretive training this year is questionable due to staff time and commitments.
21. The IRNHA sales outlet is open and operational at the new park headquarters office.
