Indian Well Campground Open for Summer Season

TULELAKE, California— Lava Beds National Monument invites the public to enjoy the monument's spring opening of the "B" loop at the Indian Well Campground. Combined with the "A" loop, which is open year round, the campground has 42 sites, along with water and toilet facilities.

"Come and stay a while!" says Superintendent Mike Reynolds, "The campground offers nice views and facilities and is a great way to relax in a natural setting."

Built in 1938 by the Civilian Conservation Corps, Indian Well Campground is located near the monument's visitor center and offers a convenient centrally located point from which to visit the geologic features, caves, historic resources and stories of Lava Beds National Monument, and the surrounding national wildlife refuges and national forest lands.

There is a \$10 entrance fee per vehicle for a 7 day visit to the monument and a nightly camping fee of \$10 per site.

Lava Beds National Monument, established in 1925, is a land of turmoil, both geologic and historic. Over the last half-million years, volcanic eruptions have created a rugged landscape dotted with diverse volcanic features. Lava tube caves, Native American sites, historic battlefields and a high desert wilderness experience await you!
