Lava Beds & Tule Lake Unveil New Information panels for Area Visitors!

New information panels designed to educate and attract potential visitors to Lava Beds National Monument and the Tule Lake Unit have been installed in Tulelake Basin communities and along traffic corridors.

The panels have been placed both along the I-5 corridor in California and the gateway community of Merrill, Oregon and offer visitors a hint, of the fun, interesting and educational experiences they will find at both National Park Service locations.

The new panels, along with giving a short interpretive message about each park, provide a detailed map to the sites and QR codes to allow potential visitors the opportunity to visit the parks' webpages for more detailed information about each site.
