Information and Regulations



Fees Fees are posted at the entrance to the campground and are payable immediately upon occupying a campsite. Single sites are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Group sites require reservations. Call 702-293-8906.

Site Capacity No more than two vehicles (one recreational vehicle) are permitted in any one site. Four motorcycles may occupy a site. Motor vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas only and may not be driven onto the dirt or across irrigation ditches. Also, there is a maximum of eight persons per site.

Stay Limits 30 days - Boulder Beach, Las Vegas Bay, Echo Bay, Callville Bay, Temple Bar, Willow Beach, Katherine Landing and Cottonwood Cove. Check out time is noon. Maximum stay within the recreation area is 90 days within any consecutive 12-month period.

Personal Property Leaving property unattended for longer than 24 hours is prohibited unless authorized in writing by the superintendent.

Shhhh! Quiet hours are 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Please do not create or sustain unreasonable noise, including generators, during those hours. Loud music and other unreasonable noise is not permitted at any time.

Campfires Do not leave fires unattended. Driftwood may be collected only from below the high water line for use in campfires. Ground fires are allowed only in designated metal fire rings where available. Firewood may be purchased at concession stores.

Water Use Please wash dishes at your campsite and not at the water faucets. Do not drain contaminated water on the ground; use the service sink at the rest room. Dump holding tanks at sanitary stations located at each campground. Except for filling storage tanks, do not connect hoses to water faucets.

Pets Pets must be kept on a leash not to exceed six feet in length at all times. They should not be left unattended. We also require that you clean up after your pet at all times.

Wildlife Please do not feed the wildlife. This is dangerous for the wildlife and for you.
