



March Hike Schedule



The National Park Service is presenting a variety of guided hikes and programs throughout March. Hikes and programs will occur at different times and locations in Lake Mead National Recreation Area. For more information and reservations call the Alan Bible Visitor Center at 702.293.8990 between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Reservations are required on all hikes. Please leave your dogs at home.

Saturday, March 7

White Owl Canyon

This is an intriguing hike that begins near the water's edge and winds into a narrow canyon where birds of prey have been spotted in the past. Perhaps you will catch a glimpse of other wildlife as well. Loop back through a nearby canyon and then traverse across the desert near the Old Lakeshore Road. This is a moderate 6-mile hike with some rock scrambling.

Tuesday, March 10

Native versus Non Native blooms

Spring has sprung, and the desert is blooming. Along with our beautiful native flowers, invasive weeds are also growing. Do they prevent more native flowers from blooming? Join Carrie from the Resource Management branch to learn more about Mojave Desert plants and flowers and what you can do to help keep our wildflowers blooming! Wednesday March 11

Historic Railroad Trail Bike Ride

Join Tony on a morning mountain bike ride along the Historic Railroad Trail. Learn the fascinating history of this cultural landmark as you ride into history on the trail that leads to Hoover Dam. Old photos and a great view of the lake are an added bonus. You will rack your mountain bike before walking a short distance to the upper level of the parking garage at the Hoover Dam. Bike locks are suggested and don't forget your helmet, day pack with water, and camera. This is a moderate to moderately-strenuous 9-mile round trip.

Saturday, March 14

Rainbow Canyon Loop

Hike through Lovell Canyon with Joan and Chuck and then detour through colorful Rainbow Canyon on your way to the remains of Anniversary Mine where the borax mineral coemanite was mined. Continue on through The Narrows before returning through Lovell Canyon. This is a strenuous 8-mile loop.

Saturday, March 14

Moonlight Hike

Experience the mystery of the Historic Railroad Trail by the light of the Mojave moon with Larry. The railroad was built to transport supplies to Hoover Dam during the 1930's when the dam was under construction. Learn the fascinating history of the railroad and of those that built this cultural landmark. This is an easy 3-mile hike overlooking the waters of Lake Mead. Don't forget your flashlight.

Saturday, March 21

Rogers Spring

Join Joan and Chuck as they hike up the wash behind Rogers Spring to a nearby canyon. The very colorful box canyon may provide opportunities to view wildlife and wildflowers. This is a moderate 6.5 mile hike.
