



Traveling Trunk Program

Lake Roosevelt National Recreation Area protects some outstanding natural and cultural features. The Missoula floods, enormous releases of water from ruptured ice dams in Montana, rushed across central Washington multiple times during the last Ice Age, shaping the area's landscape. More than 9,000 years of Native American history is protected and interpreted, especially at Kettle Falls, formerly the second largest salmon fishery on the Columbia River. Regional fur trading, Catholic missionary and U.S. military activities are preserved at Fort Colville, St. Paul's Mission and Fort Spokane.

Traveling trunks and kits are an excellent way to enhance your student's understanding of the environment and our area. The following trunks and kits are available for loan to schools in Washington and Idaho.

Each kit is packaged for shipment. The park will **ship the trunk to your school** via UPS. You ship the trunk back to the park on the last date indicated via UPS **at your expense**. You may pick up and return the trunk in person if you wish to save expenses.

Sculpted, Scoured and Scraped:

An Eastern Washington Geology Experience

3rd-6th Grades

17 million years ago, sheets of volcanic lava flowed from giant cracks in the earth near the Washington/Oregon/ Idaho border and covered eastern Washington. Ice Age glaciers covered much of the northern part of Washington and blocked rivers forming giant lakes. Glacial Lake Missoula in Montana, ruptured its ice dam and unleashed some of the largest floods that mankind has ever known onto the plains of eastern Washington.

Illustrates many of the geologic forces that shaped eastern Washington in the past and continue to shape the landscape today. The trunk comes with videos, visual aids, rock samples, equipment as well as a curriculum guide that addresses the geologic processes central to the history of eastern Washington.

Avian Mystery Kit

4th-8th Grades

Program Requirements:

There are 27 puzzle pieces. A 10 foot wide and a minimum of 52 inch tall wall area where a sheet of felt fabric can be anchored to the wall.

Program Overview:

Students share information from a puzzle piece about a bird as the puzzle is completed.

Once the puzzle is completed they will know which bird they have been describing.

Through this program students will be able to describe the status of the American Bald Eagle; identify at least 3 reasons for their decline; and identify how protection under the Environmental Protection Act has helped it's recovery. Shhhh! Don't tell them what the program is about! The less they know the more fun it is!

The 3 D's of Fort Spokane

3rd-9th

Explores why the fort was established by the military, why and how it was subsequently used as an Indian Boarding School and later a tuberculosis hospital. The trunk includes a teacher guide with lessons and information, several DVDs, books, historical photos, replica artifacts, replica military uniforms and more. Can be used before or after your class visits the Fort Spokane site.

Project Wild Salmon

3rd-HS

The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife Project WILD Salmon Education Trunk of educational activities. Filled with resources and materials about salmon.

NOTE: This trunk is very heavy. It is only available for pick up and delivery.

Fur Trade and David Thompson

3rd-MS

Contains replica items relevant to fur traders and trappers of the early 1800s along the Columbia River in the United States and Canada. Various resource materials useful in the classroom are also included.

David Thompson: Mapmaker and Explorer

3rd-MS

David Thompson was the first to travel the entire length of the Columbia River. He was famous as a mapmaker, explorer and fur trader. This trunk has replica items such as a sextant, clothing, and trade goods along with resource materials useful in the classroom.

American Indians of the Fur Trade

3rd-MS

This trunk features replica items of American Indians of the Columbia River watershed during the time when David Thompson was exploring the Columbia River. Includes resources useful in the classroom to learn about American Indian life.

Videos

“Fort Spokane Frontier Outpost to Indian Boarding School” 11 minutes

An overview of the different eras of Fort Spokane: military, boarding school, tuberculosis hospital and National Park. This video has historically been shown at the Fort Spokane Visitor Center. It is also in the Fort Spokane Traveling Trunk.

Trunks and Kits Reservations

- 4 week rental period includes **10-18 teaching days** (not including weekends and depending on which trunk) and shipping time to your school.
- The park will **ship via UPS or deliver the trunk to your school on the first date of the reservation**. You ship the trunk back to the park on the return date indicated via UPS **at your expense**. You may pick up and return the trunk in person if you wish to save expenses. Note: It is your responsibility to ensure the trunk is returned on time regardless of how it was delivered to your school.
- If you intend for more than one grade level to utilize the trunk, consider borrowing the trunk for more than one loan period.
- Choose at least 3 dates alternate dates.
