* Length is measured from the tip of the bow in a straight line to the stern. This does not include outboard motors, brackets, rudders, bow attachments, or swim platforms and ladders that are not a molded part of the hull.

	1 B-II Fire Extinguisher or 2 B-I Fire Extinguishers (USGC Marine Approved, depends on your boat configuration, check USCG regs)
	Backfire Flame Arrestor (only for gas powered inboards and inboard/outboards)
	Ventilation system with mechanical blower on vessels with a permanently installed gasoline engine not open to the atmosphere.
	Sound Producing Devices (39.4 ft and larger must also carry a bell with clapper)
	Skier-down Flag (required when towing a skier)
	Navigation Lights (required in reduced visibility)
	Carbon Monoxide (CO) Warning Sticker
	Oil Pollution Placard
	Garbage Placard
	Marine Sanitation Device (if installed, must be secured to prevent discharge)
