In order for you to be safe, you need to make sure that you have specific equipment on your watercraft any time you are on Lake Roosevelt. We have developed this checklist to help you prepare for a safe and enjoyable day on the Lake. * Length is measured from the tip of the bow in a straight line to the stern. This does not include outboard motors, brackets, rudders, bow attachments, or swim platforms and ladders that are not a molded part of the hull.

	Life Jacket: Type I, II, III, or V (one per person, must be Coast Guard approved)				
	1 USCG approved Type IV throwable personal floatation device (PFD)				
	One B-II and one B-I or three B-I type fire extinguishers (USGC Marine Approved, depends on your boat configuration, check USCG regs)				
	Backfire Flame Arrestor (only for gas powered inboards and inboard/outboards)				
	Ventilation system with mechanical blower on vessels with a permanently installed gasoline engine not open				
	to the atmosphere.				
	Sound Producing Devices (39.4 ft and larger must also carry a bell with clapper)				
	Skier-down Flag (required when towing a skier)				
	Navigation Lights (required in reduced visibility)

	Marine Sanitation Device (if installed, must be secured to prevent discharge)
