



Spokane Tribe Family of Businesses



The Spokane Tribe of Indians owns and operates the businesses listed below to help achieve our goals of self-sufficiency and an improved quality of life for our Tribe.



FISHING AND CAMPING REGULATIONS



SPOKANE TRIBAL SHORELINE CAMPGROUNDS

**At Pierre Point and from Blue Creek to Little Falls, Camping is reserved for Spokane Tribal members only.



SHORELINE CAMPGROUNDS

- \$16.00 per campsite, per night, this includes random dispersed camping.
- Permit is valid until NOON of the day following purchase.
- Camping permits must be obtained prior to or shortly after camp setup and must be visible at all times.
- A campsite shall be limited to SIX individuals, ONE tent or ONE R.V.
- No fee for day use only.
- NO all terrain vehicles (ATV) or Motorized Off Road use in campgrounds, this includes roadways by Non-Tribal Members.
- NO firearms/weapons of any kind allowed in campgrounds.
- ALL pets must be restrained at all times and under direct control of owner.

CAMPGROUNDS CONDUCT

- Fires must be attended and completely extinguished before leaving.
- Dry dead wood on the ground or driftwood from the lake shore may be used for firewood. Do not cut any standing vegetation.
- In case of extreme fire danger, campfires may be prohibited. Such closures will be posted and are strictly enforced.
- Fires are permitted in fire rings ONLY.
- Digging or leveling of campsites is NOT permitted.
- Excessive or annoying noise will NOT be allowed at any time.
- Use of illegal substances or vandalism will result in expulsion from the campground.
- Drug/Alcohol Free Campgrounds: Pierre Point and Hidden Beach per Spokane Tribal Resolution

FISHING PERMITS

Fishing/Camping permits can be acquired from the following locations:

Spokane Tribal Public Safety Building,
Wellpinit Washington

Spoko Fuel (Texaco) gas station
at Two Rivers

Spokane Tribal Rangers
& Tribal Law Enforcement Officials

- Fishing permit fees: Annual = \$20.00
7-day permit = \$8.00
- Seniors over 70yrs of age and children 14 & under FREE
- Washington State Fishing rules & regulations apply to all permit holders.
- Washington State fishing license should accompany Tribal permit.
- Fishing/Camping permits are valid for Lake Roosevelt ONLY.
- Interior Lakes & Streams of the Spokane Indian Reservation are closed to Non-Tribal members.

NOTE: TRIBAL PERMITS ARE REQUIRED IF FISHING ON THE SPOKANE INDIAN RESERVATION LAKE ROOSEVELT SHORELINE.

FISHING PERMITS DO NOT ACT AS A CAMPING PERMIT NOR SHALL A CAMPING PERMIT ACT AS A FISHING PERMIT.
