## Fees and Passes



Managing public lands requires a major financial investment. General tax revenues provide most of that investment for Lassen Volcanic National Park. Entrance fees from those who directly use the park for recreation provide additional support for maintaining park services and facilities. Eighty percent of the fees collected at Lassen are returned to the park for specific projects. Each time you pay a park entrance fee, you are making a direct investment in your park.

### Entrance Fees

#### Vehicle Fee \$10

Valid for single, private, non-commercial vehicles such as passenger cars, pickup trucks, RVs, vans, and converted buses. Valid for day of purchase and the next six days.

#### Individual Fee \$5

Per-person fee for individuals 16 years of age or older when entering by means other than a single, private, non-commercial vehicle, such as motorcycles, bicycles; taxis and limousines providing transportation only. A family traveling together shall pay no more than the vehicle fee. Valid for day of purchase and the next six days.

### Passes

For per vehicle entrance fee, pass admits pass holder and accompanying passengers in a single, private, non-commercial vehicle. For per-person entrance fee, pass admits pass holder, and three persons (16 and older). All passes are non-transferable, non-refundable, and cannot be replaced if lost or stolen. The passes generally do not cover or reduce special recreation fees or fees charged by concessionaires.

#### Lassen Annual Pass - \$25

This pass is available to anyone and is valid for one full year from month of purchase. Covers entrance fees at Lassen Volcanic National Park and Whiskeytown National Recreation Area. It can be obtained at park entrance stations or through [www.pay.gov](http://www.pay.gov). #### Interagency Annual Pass - \$80

This pass is available to anyone and is valid for one full year from the month of purchase. It can be obtained at park entrance stations, by calling 1-888-ASK-USGS, ext 1, or via the Internet at [www.store.usgs.gov/pass](http://www.store.usgs.gov/pass).

#### Interagency Senior Pass - \$10

This is a lifetime pass for U.S. citizens and permanent residents age 62 and over. The senior pass also provides a 50 percent discount on some expanded amenity fees charged for facilities and services such as camping, swimming, boat launch, and specialized interpretive services. In some areas where expanded amenity fees are charged, only the pass holder will be given the 50 percent price reduction. The senior pass can be obtained in person or through the mail. **Passes, cont'd**

**Interagency Access Pass - Free**

This is a lifetime pass for U.S. citizens and permanent residents with a permanent physical, mental, or sensory impairment that severely limits one or more major life activities. The Access Pass also provides a 50 percent discount on some expanded amenity fees charged for facilities

and services such as camping, swimming, boat launch, and specialized interpretive services. In some areas where expanded amenity fees are charged, only the pass holder will be given the 50 percent price reduction. The access pass can be obtained in person or through the mail. **Groups and Organizations**

Members of non-profit groups and organizations (church, school, public service, etc.) arriving in vehicles with capacities of 15 or more and not qualified for educational fee waivers, are charged \$5 per person over age 16 (no charge for the vehicle driver) for entrance into Lassen Volcanic

National Park. Annual or lifetime passes cover the entrance fees for the passport holder and others, as defined on the back of the pass. If the vehicle capacity is 14 or fewer the group is charged \$10, the individual automobile fee.

**Educational Fee Waivers**

Entrance fees may be waived for visits by bona fide educational or scientific institutions recognized by a federal, state, or local government entity. The group must be visiting the park as part of a scientific or educational program that specifically relates to the resources of the park. Educational

fee waivers will not be granted for visits which are solely recreational. Educational fee waivers must be obtained in advance. For information about obtaining an educational fee waiver, visit our website or contact the park's fee office at (530) 595-6121.

**Commercial Tour Fees**

A commercial tour is defined as consisting of "one or more persons traveling on an itinerary that has been packaged, priced or sold for leisure or recreational purposes by an organization that realizes financial gain through the provision of the service."

Entrance fees are based upon the total capacity of the vehicle. Possession of lifetime or annual passes, or the age of the passengers, does not

affect the price charged. Entrance fees are valid for the day of purchase and the next six days for a vehicle carrying the same group of passengers.

**Capacity Fees:**

- 1-6 passenger capacity \$25 plus \$5 per person (no charge for driver)
- 7-15 passenger capacity \$50
- 16-25 passenger capacity \$60
- 26+ passenger capacity \$150

**Special Park Usage (Administrative Fees)**

The following special use fees are per day. For information about obtaining a permit, contact the fee program office at (530) 595-6120.

**Commercial filming/video location fees**

- 1 -2 people camera with tripod only \$0
- 1 - 10 people \$150
- 11 - 30 people \$250
- 31 - 49 people \$500
- Over 50 people \$750

**Still Photography Location Fees**

- 1 - 10 people \$50
- 11 - 30 people \$150
- Over 30 people \$250

**Other Administrative Fees**

- Commercial Use Authorization \$175\*
  - Special Events \$75\*
  - Wedding Permits \$75
  - Ball field Day Use \$50
  - First Amendment Rights \$0
  - Spreading of Human Remains \$0
- \*Minimum*

*The authority for the National Park Service to recover and retain costs associated with managing special park uses is found at 16 USC 3a. Charges established for special park uses are intended to recover costs associated with managing the activities and not to generate revenues beyond actual costs.*
