



Warner Valley Campground Information

Welcome to Warner Valley Campground (elevation 5650'). Camping in Lassen Volcanic National Park can be a fun and rewarding experience. Remember that you are sharing this space with plants, animals, and other campers. Consideration and cooperation are important.

Obtaining a Campsite

Warner Valley Campground has 18 campsites and offers sites on a first-come, first-served basis only. Self register at the bulletin board within 30 minutes of your arrival. The cost for each site at Warner Valley Campground is \$16 per night when the water is on and \$12 when the water is off. Campsites cannot be saved for persons who are not present. Camping fees are not refundable and stays are limited to 14 days per year. Checkout time is 12 pm. Clip your camping permit stub to your site post to show occupancy. Camping fees must be paid within 30 minutes of occupying a site.

Campsites

Each campsite is equipped with a picnic table, fire grate, bear-proof box and parking area. Electric and water hookups are not available, though potable water spigots are available in the campground. Campsites are limited to 3 tents, 6 people, and 2 vehicles (including RV) per site. Vehicles must stay on paved/graveled areas. Help protect park resources; please do not trench or level your site or put nails in trees.

Quiet Hours and Generators

Quiet hours are from 10 pm to 6 am.

Generators may be used only from 8 am to 10 am; 12 pm to 2 pm; and 5 pm to 7 pm. Do not run continually and please keep use to a minimum so other campers are not disturbed.

Food Storage and Wildlife

This is bear country and deer, squirrels, and chipmunks are also year-round residents. **Store all food in bear-proof box provided at your campsite, including pet food.** It is illegal to feed, frighten, or disturb any wildlife. All resources such as wildflowers, plants, animals, and artifacts are protected by law in national parks. Please leave them for others to enjoy.

Campfires

Do not cut, saw, or break any standing trees, dead or alive for firewood. You may gather dead wood that is down on the ground within 30 feet of the road and less than 4 inches in diameter. Chainsaw use is not permitted. Fires are allowed only in designated fire grates. Do not build rock rings or burn trash in the grate. **Never leave fires or hot coals unattended and extinguish them completely before leaving.**

Sanitation

Wash dishes at your campsite, not at water spigots. Please do not wash clothes, hair, or bathe at water spigots. Strained dishwasher must be disposed of in the pit toilets. Dispose of food particles in trash bins. Gray water from RVs and trailers must be contained and may be disposed of outside the park or at the Manzanita Lake dump station in the northwest part of the park. Water is a precious and limited resource; use it wisely. Please sort and place all trash and recyclables in the appropriate bins.

Vehicles and Bicycles

All roads in the campground are one-way and the speed limit is 10 mph. Keep all vehicles, including motorcycles and trailers, on established roads and parking areas at all times. Bicycles are permitted on established roadways only.

Visitor Services

Be sure to check the schedule of ranger-conducted activities in the park visitor guide, Peak Experiences. Visitor centers have exhibits, maps, videos, publications, and hiking information. The Kohm Yah-mah-nee Visitor Center is located approximately 47 miles from Warner Valley, at the southwest entrance to the park; Loomis Museum is located approximately 76 miles from Warner Valley, at the northwest entrance to the park.

Pets

Pets must be attended and on a leash not longer than 6 feet at all times. It is the owner's responsibility to clean up after them. **Pets are not permitted on trails or inside park facilities.**

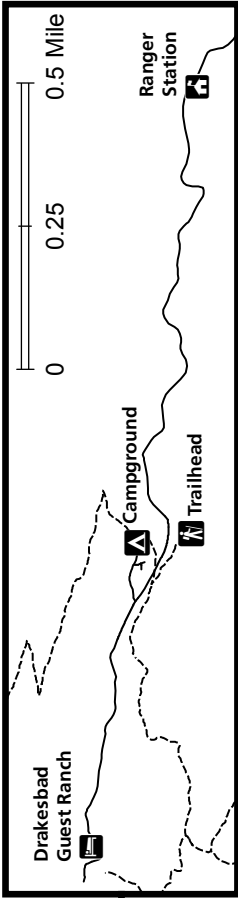
Emergencies

Warner Valley Campground

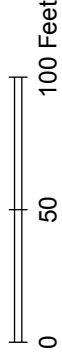


Warner Valley Area
