



WARNING: Attention Campers and Backpackers!

A Severe Winter Storm is Approaching Lassen Monday (10/12) Night through Wednesday (10/14)!

What you can expect:

- This storm has the potential to bring strong winds (40-60 mph), heavy rain, and heavy snow with blizzard-like conditions above 6,000 feet.
- The road may be closed between the Devastated Area and Sulphur Works on Monday at sunset.
- Rockfalls, flooding, and downed trees are expected along the road.
- Any vehicles caught behind the road closure will be stuck there until the road can be re-opened. This could take multiple days, or depending on the storm, may not happen until next year during spring opening.

What you should do:

- Complete all backcountry trips and exit the section of the road between the Devastated Area and Sulphur Works by Monday afternoon (this includes the Summit Lake South Campground).
- If you are going to stay in the park Monday night, plan to camp at the Manzanita Lake Campground or the Southwest Campground.
- Monitor the weather situation carefully. The Loomis Museum and Kohm Yah-mah-nee Visitor center will have up-to-date weather forecasts available.
- Prepare for winter driving conditions.
