I should stay close to my family.




If I need help, I can ask a park ranger for help!

I should stay behind the railing's downstairs. I touch these, and that is OK. Upstairs I should stay on the blue carpet.




Inside may be crowded and a little noisy. I may hear the front door shut loudly.
