



Boott Cotton Mills Museum
 Experience the roar of a 1920s weave room with operating power looms. The museum also includes interactive exhibits, a kids' Discovery Trail, and video programs about mill work.

Mill Girls & Immigrants Exhibit
 What was life like outside the textile factories? Visit an 1830s Boott Mills boardinghouse to explore the personal stories of Lowell's 19th and 20th-century working people.

power up
River Transformed Exhibit
 Tour 19th-century turbines, learn how engineers harnessed the waterpower to drive Lowell's mills, and consider industry's environmental impact, past and present.

Rivers and Canals
 Go outside! Navigate the Canalway walking trail for a dynamic view of Lowell's extraordinary 19th-century power canal system and the Merrimack River.
