Visitor Center

Get oriented, pick up maps and family activities, make tour reservations, view exhibits, and shop in the Museum Store. Don't miss our 20-minute introductory film, shown every half hour. Visitor parking at 304 Dutton St. *Recommended time: 30-45 minutes.*

Boott Cotton Mills Museum

Experience the roar of a 1920s weave room featuring operating power looms. See cloth being made and explore interactive exhibits, a kids' Discovery Trail, and video programs about mill work. *Recommended time: 60-75 minutes. Fees apply.*

head home

Mill Girls & Immigrants Exhibit

40 French St.

What was life like outside the textile factories? Visit an 1830s Boott Mills boardinghouse to discover the personal stories of Lowell's 19th and 20th-century communities. *Recommended time: 30 minutes.*

ride the rails

Park Trolleys

All aboard! Lowell National Historical Park's trolley cars provide free shuttle service between the Visitor Center Trolley Stop and the Boott Cotton Mills Museum Trolley Stop. *Please see a park ranger for daily schedule.*


