

Bird Checklist

Potential bird encounters in the park throughout the calendar year.



Unique within the NPS, Marsh-Billings-Rockefeller NHP is mandated to carry on the practice of forestry within its borders. The park follows “bird-friendly” forest management as defined by Audubon Vermont’s Foresters for the Birds program. Visit recently thinned forests for diverse breeding birds, hayfields for Bobolinks, and the 14 acre Pogue for spring and fall waterfowl. Most importantly- enjoy birdwatching!

Seasonality

S	spring	March - May

Chance of Detection:

A - Abundant: Occurs in moderate to large numbers and easily found in appropriate habitat.

C - Common: Found in moderate numbers and usually easy to find in appropriate habitat.

U - Uncommon: Small numbers and usually, but not always, found with some effort in appropriate habitat.

R - Rare: Occurs annually in very small numbers or in a very restricted habitat. Difficult to find.

O - Occasional: Found some years, but not every year.

Blank spaces either indicate species absence or insufficient data.
