First Manassas Commemorative Program Tickets Available

The National Park Service and the Virginia Sesquicentennial of the American Civil War Commission are offering free general admission tickets to the July 21 Commemorative Program. The tickets are available at the Manassas National Battlefield Henry Hill Visitor Center, 6511 Sudley Road, Manassas, Virginia. The Henry Hill Visitor Center is open from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily. Tickets are available first come, first served.

The Commemorative Program will open at 9:15 a.m. on Thursday, July 21, with a ceremony on the grounds of Henry Hill at the park Visitor Center. Scheduled speakers include Robert F. McDonnell, Governor of Virginia, and key local, state, and federal officials. Dr. Edward L. Ayers, president of the University of Richmond and historian of the American South, will give the keynote address titled "The Battle of Manassas: America's Brief Civil War."

July 21 is a fee-free day in the park. Events on July 22, 23, and 24 are open to the general public for the general admission fee of \$3 per person.
