11:00 a.m. *A Forgotten Odyssey*
52-minute documentary. Survivors tell stories of the forced Soviet annexation of eastern Poland during World War II, when entire towns and communities were deported to Siberia and Kazakhstan to Soviet forced labor camps.

2:00 p.m. *The International Gulag*
80-minute documentary. Hundreds of foreigners from many nations were secretly deported into Soviet Gulag camps, including American survivor John Noble, arrested at his father's camera factory in Dresden, Germany. John's story and those of other non-Russians are told in this film, exposing an often overlooked period of history.
