The National Park Service is pleased to sponsor the fourteenth annual Maggie L. Walker Summer Leadership Institute, July 10-13 and July 17-20, 2023. We are seeking outstanding, middle and high school-age students to benefit from this free program.

Park Information

Maggie L. Walker National Historic Site, home of the first African American woman in the United States to become president of a chartered bank, has been a National Park site since 1978. In addition to being a leader in the Independent Order of St. Luke, an important benevolent association, Maggie L. Walker was a philanthropist, a feminist, and an early advocate of civil rights, becoming active in many national organizations and fostering the economic empowerment of generations of women and African Americans.

The Institute

The Leadership Institute provides a two week experiential program for youth interested in developing leadership skills and participating in community service projects. It is a free program open to rising 8th through 10th grade students in the greater Richmond area and is limited to fourteen participants. The program meets

Monday through Thursday, July 10-13 and Monday through Thursday, July 17-20, 9am - 2pm each day, onsite at Maggie L. Walker NHS. Participants can also earn additional volunteer hours during the annual Maggie L. Walker Birthday Celebration, July 14-16, 2023.

Goals of the Institute

Maggie Walker's earliest leadership role in the Order was as Matron of the Juvenile Department, helping young people learn self-discipline, self-help, and selflessness, and showing young leaders the importance of helping others and their communities. Following Mrs. Walker's example, this program inspires participants to be future leaders through cultivating their sense of pride in heritage, focusing on the habits of

effective teens, exposing them to successful community leaders, and helping them create a personal plan for the future. The goal is to teach students to become engaged citizens, serving their community proudly and developing strong character traits to better understand themselves and their place as an integral component of a wider global community.
