Foundation Document Review

Park staff have worked with others to draft a “quick read” document, called a foundation document. It will be used to guide planning and management of Minidoka National Historic Site, (which includes *Minidoka* in Idaho and the *Bainbridge Island Japanese American Exclusion Memorial* in the state of Washington). The draft briefly explains the core purpose and significance of these sites, the most important resources and values, and the focal points of public engagement.



All 409 park units in the park system will have a foundation document by 2016, the 100-year anniversary of the creation of the National Park Service.

The foundation document builds on past planning efforts: the 2006 General Management Plan and the 2013 Long Range Interpretive Plan, which both underwent a rigorous public review process. The draft foundation document may be revised based on stakeholder feedback and an internal review process.
