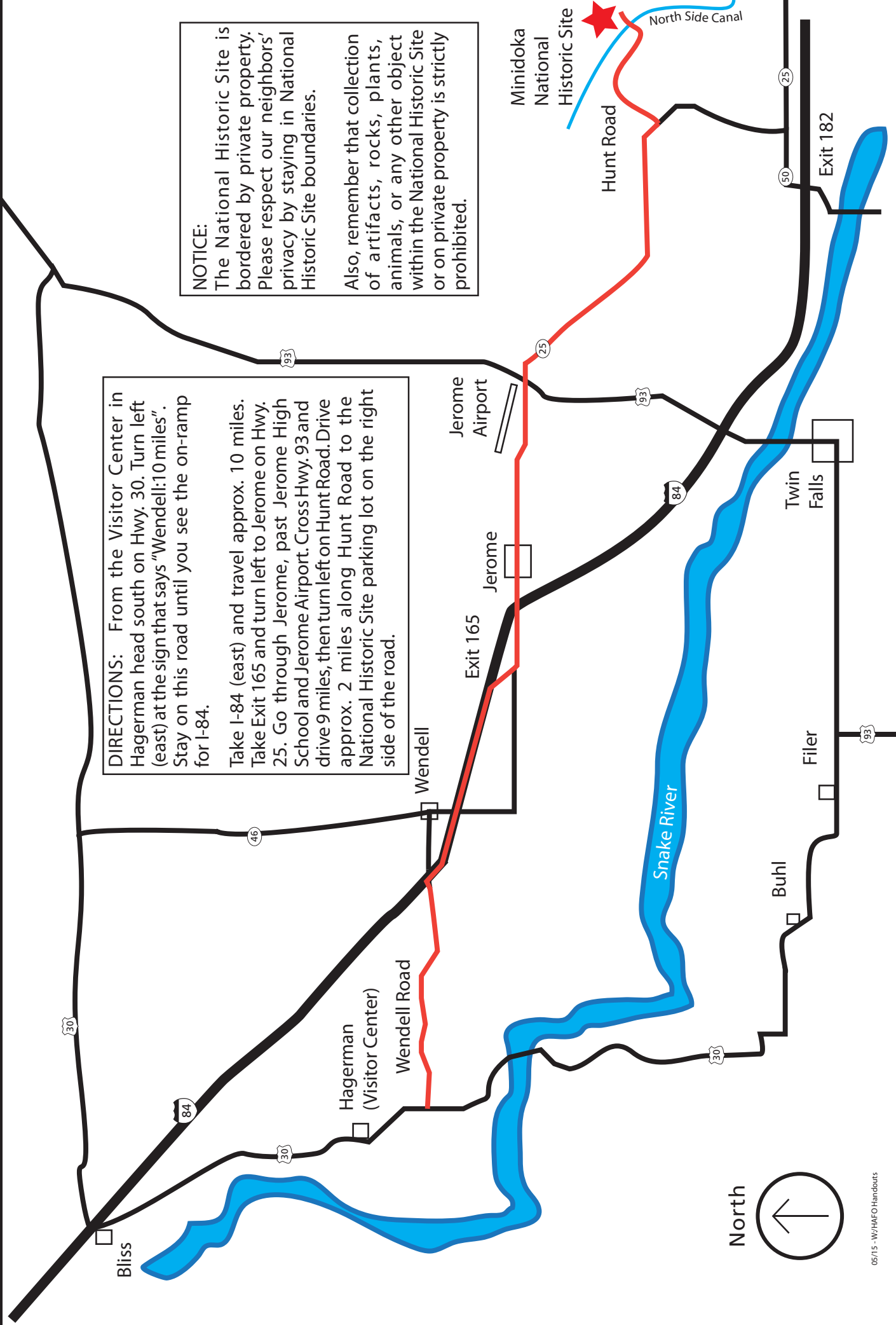


# Minidoka Location Map

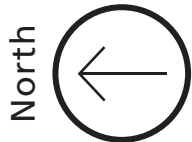


**DIRECTIONS:** From the Visitor Center in Hagerman head south on Hwy. 30. Turn left (east) at the sign that says "Wendell:10 miles". Stay on this road until you see the on-ramp for I-84.

Take I-84 (east) and travel approx. 10 miles. Take Exit 165 and turn left to Jerome on Hwy. 25. Go through Jerome, past Jerome High School and Jerome Airport. Cross Hwy. 93 and drive 9 miles, then turn left on Hunt Road. Drive approx. 2 miles along Hunt Road to the National Historic Site parking lot on the right side of the road.

**NOTICE:** The National Historic Site is bordered by private property. Please respect our neighbors' privacy by staying in National Historic Site boundaries.

Also, remember that collection of artifacts, rocks, plants, animals, or any other object within the National Historic Site or on private property is strictly prohibited.

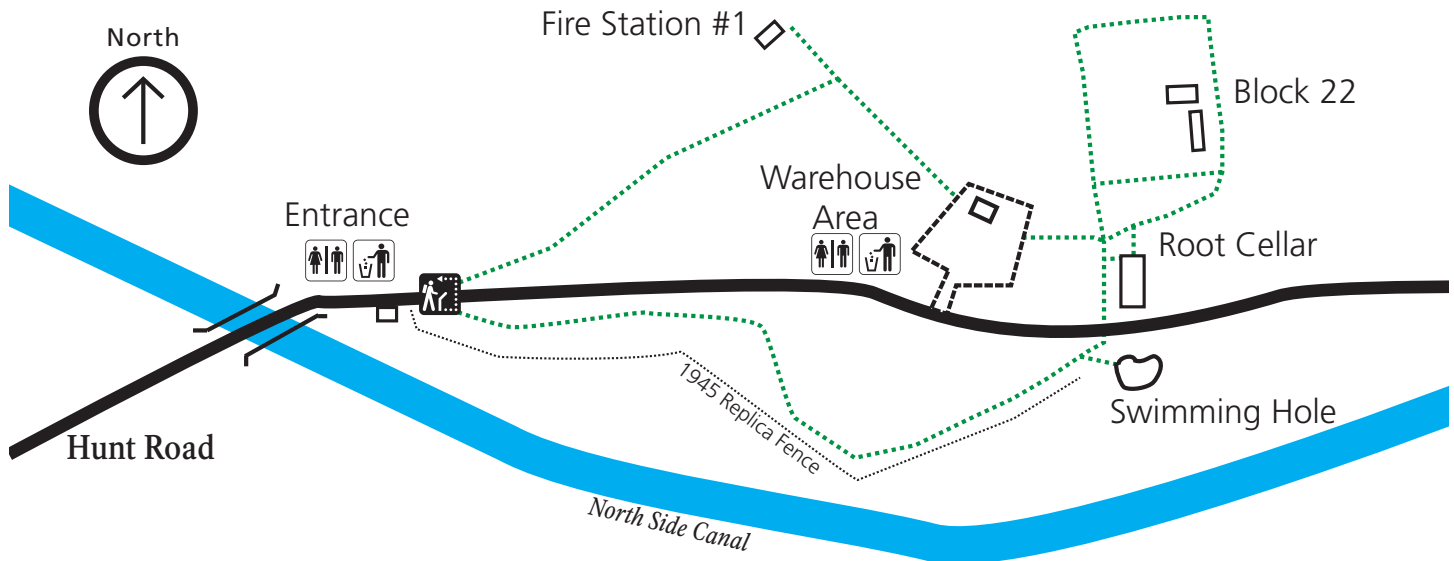

## Interpretive Trail



Welcome! You are on a trail that loops through a portion of the Historic Minidoka Relocation Center.

Help us protect your park's resources. Please stay on the trail for your own safety (you are in rattlesnake and tick habitat).

Be prepared: Take water, use sunscreen, and wear sturdy shoes.

*The site is open sunrise to sunset. Report suspicious activity to any park employee or call (208)933-4100. In an emergency dial 911*

### Trail Information

1.6 Miles round trip (2.6 km)



Entire trail is handicapped-accessible.  
*(The surface is compacted crushed stone)*



Pets must be on leash in parking areas.  
Only service animals allowed on trail.



Leave no trace. Pack out all trash.



No swimming in the North Side Canal. Undercurrents are swift and dangerous.



No smoking on trail.



ATVs, Horses, and Bicycles not permitted on trail.

*Note: Under Federal Law (16 U.S.C. 470aa-470mm) It is illegal to dig in, or to take, purchase, sell, receive, or transport materials take from this site. Damaging the site can result in fines of up to \$250,000, and up to five years in prison.*
