Wayside Notes

In the early 1900's, the Nisqually to Paradise Road was built to offer the best views possible as visitors approached the mountain. As you can imagine, this historic route requires maintenance and periodic repairs. Due to adverse winter weather, road work must take place during the busy summer season.

This year the majority of the project will occur between Longmire and Paradise.

Each year thousands of vehicles, cycles of freeze and thaw and falling trees take their toll on the road. Improvements to the road are necessary to preserve its integrity as a popular and historic scenic drive and to provide continued safe access for years to come.

Just the Facts: First in our Hearts, Fifth in the Country

"Of all the fire mountains which like beacons, once blazed along the Pacific Coast, Mount Rainier is the noblest." -John Muir

Although the National Park Service celebrated its 100th Birthday this week, Mount Rainier is a bit older. In 1899, Mount Rainier became the fifth national park in the country. At that time Rainier was in good company with Yellowstone, Sequoia, Yosemite and General Grant (now Kings Canyon) National Parks.

What to Expect

- **Road Construction** will take place June through late October, 2016.
- **Work this week** will take place in various "pockets" along the road from Longmire to Paradise. Expect limited parking or interrupted access at trailheads and pullouts along the road. Due to construction work at **Christine and Narada Falls**, there will be limited access to parking areas.
- **Expect delays of up to 30 minutes** (total) during daylight hours, Monday through Friday between Longmire and Paradise.
- **Be Aware of Closures.** The entire Ricksecker Point Loop Road and the parking area at Glacier Bridge will be closed June through early fall.
- **No Idling.** Please be considerate of air quality and turn off your vehicle when stopped at construction.
- **Plan Ahead.** Due to higher visitation this summer, visitors are encouraged to arrive either early in the morning or late in the afternoon. Restroom facilities are located at Kautz Creek, Longmire, Narada Falls and Paradise.
