

Determination to Change Mount Rainier National Park Regulations

Consistent with applicable legislation and Federal administrative policies, and based upon a determination that such action is necessary for the maintenance of public health and safety, protection of environmental or scenic values, protection of natural or cultural resources, aid to scientific research, implementation of management responsibilities, equitable allocation and use of facilities, or the avoidance of conflict among visitor use activities, the Superintendent makes the following changes to Mount Rainier National Park Regulations.

1. Regulation change:

Effective September 5, 2026, and until further notice, the following areas are closed (see list and map):

2. Previous regulation(s) affected by this change:

This is an administrative regulation change adopted for the Sunrise and Plummer Peak areas within Mount Rainier National Park. The previous regulations allowed public entry into these areas.

4. Reasons for change:

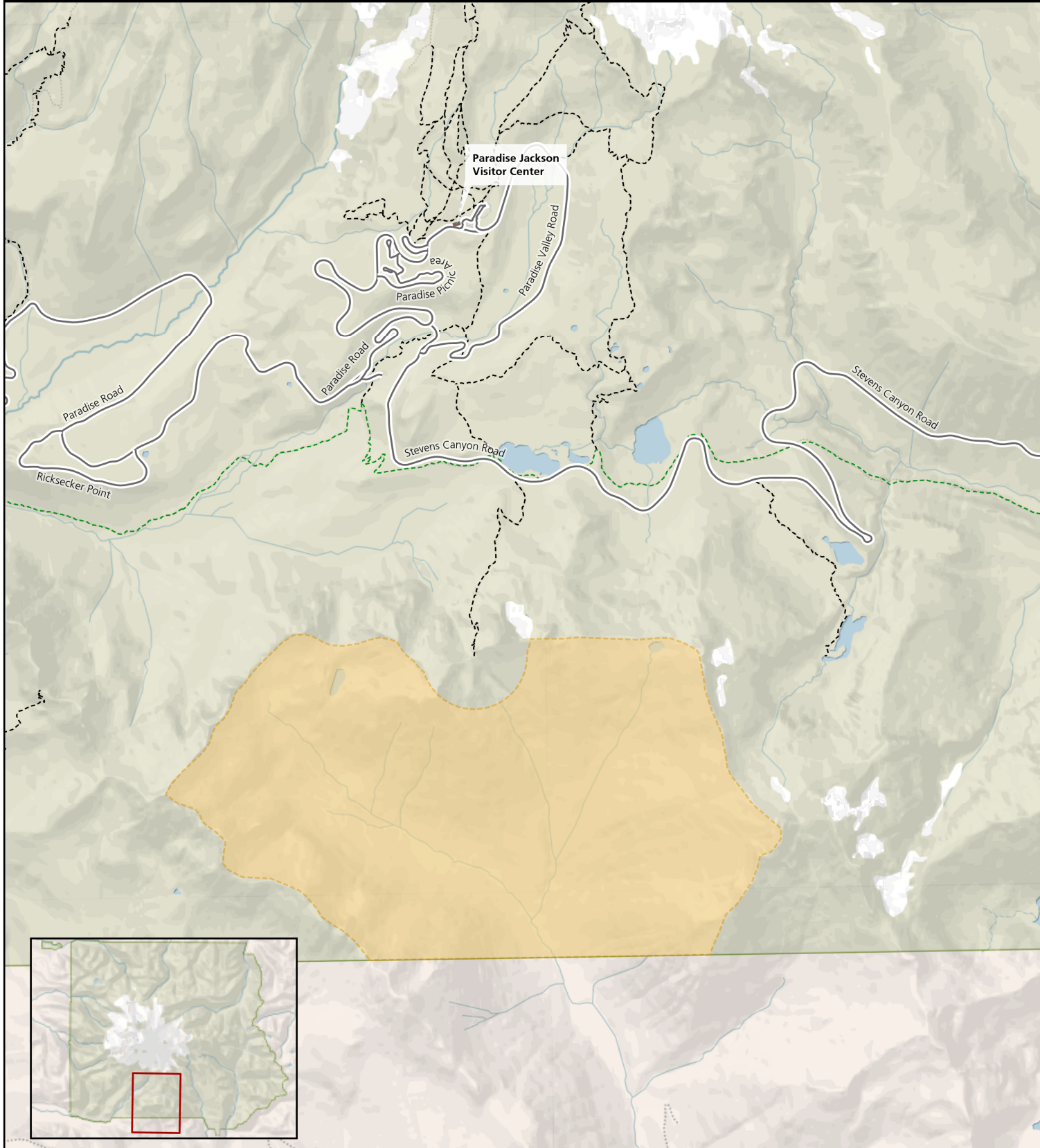
This closure is designed to protect the public due to the active Grand Park 2 Fire, Wonderland Complex and Plummer Peak Fire. Active suppression efforts, including aviation and ground operations, require clear and unobstructed access to operate effectively. Restricting visitor entry prevents interference with critical emergency resources and to provide for public safety during active fires. This area will remain closed until conditions are deemed safe for reopening.

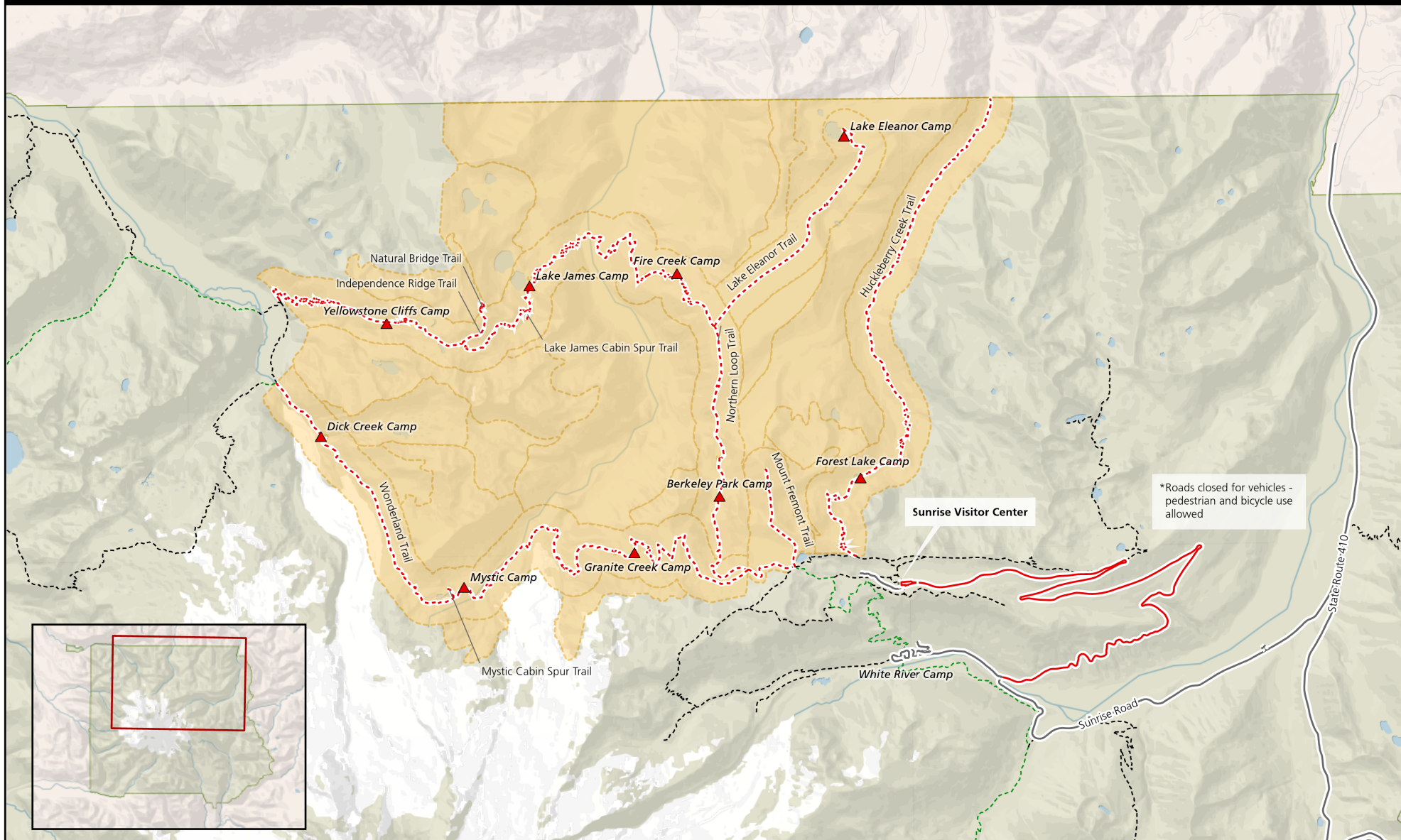
