Morristown National Historical Park to Begin Off-Season Hours of Visitor Services on November 1, 2014 October 10, 2014

Morristown, NJ – Beginning on November 1, 2014, Morristown NHP will begin its off-season hours of operation for visitor services as follows:

Washington's Headquarters Museum

Monday and Tuesday – Closed

Wednesday through Sunday – 9:30 am to 5:00 pm

Closed Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day

Ford Mansion

Monday and Tuesday – Closed

Wednesday through Sunday – tour times at 10 am, 11 am, 1 pm, 2 pm, 3 pm and 4 pm

Tours are limited to 20 visitors per tour. You can purchase tickets at Washington's Headquarters Museum. All tickets are first come first served, no reservations.

Jockey Hollow Visitor Center

Monday and Tuesday – Closed

Wednesday through Sunday – 9:30 am to 5:00 pm

Please note that the grounds of the park will remain open 7 days per week along with the restroom facilities at the Jockey Hollow area (Visitor Center and NY Brigade Comfort Station) per park hours listed at www.nps.gov/morr.

Morristown National Historical Park preserves, protects, and commemorates the landscapes, structures, features, and museum collections of the Continental Army winter encampments, the

headquarters of General George Washington, and related Revolutionary War sites at Morristown, New Jersey for the benefit and inspiration of the public. The park interprets the history and subsequent commemoration of these encampments and the extraordinary fortitude of the officers and enlisted men under Washington's leadership. Morristown NHP also represents a continuum of our nation's efforts to protect our common heritage: as the very first "national historical park", the park was also established to commemorate, preserve, and memorialize American history and heritage.
