



- Relatively little major post-1930 development has occurred; new construction has been placed outside of the core historic area and down-slope, outside of primary view sheds.

Owner of Property: Federal

Acreage of Property: Approximately 53 acres

Origins of Nomination: Via an interagency agreement with the Department of Veterans Affairs Federal Preservation Office (VA FPO), and through a Cooperative Agreement with the National Council on Public History, the NPS contracted for a context study to assess significance and develop NHL nominations.

Potential for Positive Public Response or Reflection on NHL Program:

- Recognition of the NHDVS as a nationally significant resource, will help Americans better understand the commitment of the federal government to its military veterans.
- The successor of this ground-breaking federal policy in veterans care is of current national interest.

Potential for Negative Public Response or Reflection on NHL Program: None known.
