For thousands of years, many different people have called Kansas home. Nicodemus National Historic Site is on the traditional homelands of many Indigenous people, including:

These Indigenous cultures are represented today by over 12 Federally Recognized Indian Tribes.




What did you have to do to earn the deed to the land?

This is what Ma and Pa had to do to claim their land:


- Live on the land

- Pay a filing fee. It was the only money required.


Anyone over 21 or the head of a household could apply for free federal land, as long as they:

- Did not fight against or help enemies of the United States.

How big is your school compared to this one?




DISTRICT #1 SCHOOL (1918)


FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH (1907)


