


-  Designated campsite. Camping is allowed only where specified on your back-country permit, at areas shown on the map.
-  Composting toilet. For solid human waste only -- please urinate on rock or trail. Please do not deposit trash and use minimal amounts of toilet paper, or pack the used paper out.
-  Fires are not permitted at Boundary Camp or anywhere on Copper Ridge.
-  Pets are not permitted on Copper Ridge or other trails within the National Park.
-  **PROPER FOOD STORAGE IS ESSENTIAL.** Never leave food unattended whether day hiking or camping. If camping overnight, take a bear canister or properly hang food/trash/toiletries. Keep a clean camp and do not feed the wildlife.
-  Please stay on trail, rock or snow at all times in order to protect the fragile vegetation from trampling. Do not cut switchbacks.
-  2.3 Mileage between camps (unless otherwise noted).
