Required Standards and General Notes:			
Required Personal Protective Equipment:	Gloves, eye protection, dust mask (optional if working outdoors; recommended if working indoors or personally sensitive to paint fumes)		
Tools and Equipment:	Paint, paint thinners & cleaning solvents, paint brush/roller, can opener/screwdriver, stir stick, hand axe, wire brush, paint scrapers		
Sequence of Job Steps	Potential Hazards/ Injury sources	Safe Action or Procedure	
1. Open Paint Can	SB = Punctures or cuts from screwdriver or can opener	Wear gloves; work with pointed/sharp tool edges pointed away from yourself	
2. Stir/mix/pour paint	CBY = Paint splashes in eyes/on skin E = Exposure to paint fumes	Wear eye protection, gloves; work on level surfaces Work in well ventilated areas; consider wearing dust mask	
3. Painting	CBY = Splashes in eyes/on skin E = Exposure to paint fumes O = Muscle strain from repetitive motion, reaching awkward positions CBY = cuts from sharp tools (hand axe, paint scraper)	Wear eye protection, gloves; paint slowly to reduce splash Work in well ventilated areas; consider wearing dust mask Take rest breaks as needed; position body to minimize awkward movements Wear gloves, keep blade preparation tool under control at all times, cut away from yourself	
4. Cleaning brushes/rollers	E = Exposure to paint fumes, chemicals, etc.	Work in well ventilated areas; thoroughly wash hands and exposed skin immediately after work is completed; consider wearing dust mask
