
Plains Historic Preservation District



POINTS OF INTEREST

Jimmy Carter National Historical Park

Plains High School (1921) School that Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter attended. Designated the State School of Georgia in 1979.

Plains Depot (1888) Site of Jimmy Carter's 1976 presidential campaign headquarters.

*Jimmy Carter Boyhood Farm (1922) Exhibit farm depicting life as it was when Jimmy Carter lived here.

Carter Home and Garden (1961) The Carters have resided here since leaving the White House. (Closed to the public.)

Plains

- *Lebanon Cemetery (1848) Remains of the Lebanon settlement, which eventually consolidated into Plains.
- *Rylander House (built about 1850) Known locally as the Haunted House; Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter lived here from 1955 to 1961.

Lebanon Baptist Church (1871) Moved to this site from Lebanon Cemetery; also the site of the Plains Institutional School.

Business District (1896) Centerpoint of the Jimmy Carter Preservation District and includes downtown businesses.

Williams Peanut Warehouse (1896) An agricultural supply warehouse operating since 1896.

Plains Baptist Church (1906) Earl and Lillian Carter worshiped here with their children—Jimmy, Ruth, Gloria, and Billy.

St. Andrews Evangelical Lutheran Church (1907) Rosalynn attended as a child with her grandmother, Rosa Wise.

Plains United Methodist Church (1910) Rosalynn attended as a child and married Jimmy Carter here in 1946.

Rosalynn Smith Carter Childhood Home (1920) Home where Rosalynn lived until her marriage to Jimmy Carter.

Lillian Carter Health & Rehabilitation (1921) Originally the Wise Sanitarium, this building is where Jimmy Carter was born on October 1, 1924.

Billy Carter's Service Station (1952) Billy Carter's business from 1972 to 1981; press gathered here during the campaign.

Public Housing Unit 9A (1953) The Carters lived here from 1953 to 1955 after Jimmy left the US Navy to take over the family peanut business.

Plain Peanut (1961) Location of the Carter Peanut Warehouse business from 1961 to the 1980s.

- ***Smiling Peanut** (1976) From a Carter rally in Indiana, a reminder of the peanut imagery of the campaign.
- *Maranatha Baptist Church (built 1978) The Carters joined in 1981 and still attend services here.

Plains Solar Collectors (2017) Installed on Carter land, the collectors generate about 60% of Plains' energy demand.
