## Celebrating the First President

On April 30, 1783 George Washington became the first president of the newly created United States of America. The National Park Service (NPS) with the help of the National Archives and Record Administration and the Van Cortlandt House Museum is celebrating the 226 anniversary of that momentous occasion with a day of special programming.

Meet the first president on his first day in office in the Inaugural Gallery on the first floor.

Then, learn more about Washington as a leader during America's first crucial years with special Ranger talks at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. on the lower level.

The National Archives and Record Administration will also be on hand to showcase and interpret documents relevant to Washington and his career.

Follow in Washington's footsteps with the self-guided walking tour "Washington's New York." Pick up a copy of the guide at the ranger desk in the rotunda at Federal Hall and discover what Manhattan was like during the late 18th century.
