

Dear Ms. Shull:

As the State Historic Preservation Officer for North Carolina, I am requesting the formal delisting of two properties in Wake County, North Carolina, as the designated buildings were moved without prior approval from the National Park Service.

They are:

Merrimon House, Raleigh – The Merrimon House stood at 526 North Wilmington Street in Raleigh when it was listed in the National Register on September 5, 1975. It was moved in 2008 by the then owner, the State of North Carolina, to 500 North Blount Street in Raleigh. The house was the only historic resource on the property. Photographs of the house in the original location and the current location along with an aerial map showing both locations are attached as documentation of the move.

Pugh House, Morrisville – The Pugh House and smokehouse stood at 10018 Chapel Hill Road in Morrisville when they were listed in the National Register on September 11, 2003. Both buildings were moved on January 12, 2008, by the then owner, the Town of Morrisville, to 103 Page Street in Morrisville. The two buildings were the only designated historic resources on the property. Photographs of the house and smokehouse in the original location and in the current location along with an aerial map showing both locations are attached as documentation of the move.






