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New Photographic Imaging Policy

- The photographic imaging policy is being designed to help transition into an electronic and web accessible National Register of Historic Places.
 - An entirely electronic National Register of Historic Places nomination form (Form) process within the next 60 months
 - This would include an electronic template, maps, images and signature all delivered electronically.

The northwestern bedroom has a plastered ceiling and walls, a 2003 chandelier, approximately 12-inch baseboards, ca. 1915 metal wall vents with molding, and narrow wooden floor boards laid parallel to one another. Its eastern wall includes a central fireplace with beige glazed tile facing; a decorative metal grate frame with a flared upper portion; and a wooden mantel with columns, curved carving below the ledge, and a curved central upper portion. On each side of the fireplace are wooden paneled doors; the northern one leads to the northeastern bedroom and the southern one leads to a closet. In the northern wall is a one-over-one window. In the western wall is a wooden paneled door leading to the deck. Another paneled wooden door in the southern wall leads to the central hall.



The embellishment on this northwestern bedroom knob is typical of hardware throughout the house.

A small hall serves the two southwestern upper rooms. It has narrow wooden floor boards laid perpendicularly to the walls in its western half and laid parallel to the walls in its eastern half, a cased opening between the two halves, approximately 12-inch wooden baseboards, and plastered walls and ceiling.

Current Policy

The purpose of this notification is to clarify National Park Service policy concerning the embedding of images (e.g. photographs, historic views, maps) within the text of a National Register of Historic Places nomination form. Current policy strongly discourages embedding black-and-white images within the text of a nomination (sections 7 and 8 of the form). Current policy also does not permit embedding of any color images within the text of a nomination.


Figure 10. Modern concrete bridge on the Canoa Ranch portion of the Tucson-Nogales Railroad.




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Scanning Project



- We are currently scanning our files and putting them into our new database. We have scanned about 25% of our collection.
- We are scanning the form and photographs.
- Creating text searchable pdfs.
- We are updating and correcting our NRIS database as we go.




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Scanning Process

- Prepare each file to be scanned by hand.
- Send the files to digitizing companies.
- Scan text at 400 dpi bitonal.
- Scan photographs at 300 dpi grayscale.
- Turn resulting tifs into pdfs.
- Check pdfs against paper file for accuracy.
- Post digital versions online.
- Send paper files National Archives.

Next up: Oregon, Rhode Island, finishing South Carolina


Scanning


Restricted Properties



- We are taking steps to keep restricted information from going online.
- Shortly we will send out a list of the properties that we have as restricted from your state.
- We are redacting each of the restricted properties, and scanning two versions, one complete copy of the file, and a second version that is redacted and does not include photographs.

Google Earth Layers

- We plotted the UTM coordinates and created Google Earth Layers
- Checked coordinates for accuracy (no more properties off the coast of India)
- All listed properties are in layers for Google Earth and are in the download section of the database.
