- Create a [USAJobs.gov](https://www.usajobs.gov) account at [USAJobs.gov](https://www.usajobs.gov)
- Search for “National Park Service” and select “Temporary” in the “Appointment Type” filter to find our seasonal jobs
- Use the USAJobs Resume Builder tool to build your federal government resume

- Set up alerts on your USAJobs account for jobs and the locations where you want to work
- Tailor your resume to the job – look through all the job descriptions and application questions before finalizing your resume
- Applicant limits apply – don’t wait to submit!
