Every Kid in a Park, Every Kid on a Trail

SANTA FE, N.M.: President Obama created a new initiative called “Every Kid in a Park” to give every child a chance to explore America’s great outdoors and unique history. National Trails Intermountain Region invites children to discover national historic trails and Find Your Park at the same time by visiting the national park sites that the trails pass through or nearby.

The initiative launched on September 1, 2015 and provides every child attending 4th grade (or if homeschooled, aged 10) a pass to waive entrance fees for the child and his or her family for one year. Kids can participate by visiting the Every Kid in a Park website where they can complete an educational activity and be awarded a personalized voucher number to print and use at any federal public land or water site. Fourth grade educators can also gain fee-free access for their students by visiting the website’s “Educators” section. For more information please visit: www.everykidinapark.gov.
