



Internship Opportunity Architectural Historian Associate (Boston, MA)


The National Park Service, in partnership with the National Council of Preservation Education and the Olmsted Center for Landscape Preservation, is currently seeking an Architectural Historian Associate to conduct research on historic structures and evaluate and document the condition of historic structures in the parks through the National Park Service Cultural Resources Inventory System – Historic Structures (CRIS-HS) database. As an integral part of the Olmsted Center team and under the mentorship of an experienced historic preservationist, the Associate will:

- Conduct historic research using primary and secondary resources
- Conduct field work to inventory and analyze the condition of historic buildings and structures
- Document and describe the historic buildings and structures through original narrative and photography.

The Olmsted Center promotes the preservation of cultural landscapes, including historic buildings and structures, through research, planning, stewardship and education by providing technical assistance to parks and historic properties. Qualifications: The ideal candidate will have knowledge of historic architecture, cultural landscapes, historic preservation practices and the National Register of Historic Places criteria; strong research and writing skills are required and an interest in public land management is a plus. Must be a United States citizen.

Location and Compensation: This internship is based in Olmsted Center offices in Boston, but due to the pandemic, it will be hosted remotely until otherwise notified. This 7-month internship (1200 hours) is compensated with a \$600 a week stipend and requires a commitment to a 40-hour/week work schedule. Project travel costs are reimbursed in full, commuting costs are subsidized. Housing is not provided.
