# Fiscal Year 2025 Technical Preservation Services (TPS) Annual Work Plan – Guidance, Publications, Training, and Outreach

## Tax Incentives Administrative Program Guidance

- Phased projects and documentation requirements for <u>HPCA applications</u> (new)
- <u>Preliminary Consultations</u> (to be revised)
- <u>"White-box" condition in secondary tenant spaces that were historically finished and for</u> which a tenant has yet to be identified (to be revised)
- Part 1 Preliminary determinations of individual eligibility (PDILs) and required level of documentation in <u>HPCA applications</u> (new)

- On-demand recorded training webinars from the presentations given at the September 2023 in-person advanced training for frequent tax incentives program-users and reprised in a series of webinars in spring 2024. The training focuses on how the NPS and SHPOs review <u>Historic Preservation Certification Applications (HPCA)</u> so that applicants may better anticipate questions and avoid incomplete applications, applications being put on hold for more information, additional conditions of approval, problematic treatment issues that can hold up review of your projects, and the main reasons projects go awry at the Part 3 project completion stage.
- New training (currently in development) on the interpretation and application of the <u>Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation</u>, to either first be presented in an in-person format, as was done last year for the training on the tax incentives program for frequent program users, or virtually.
