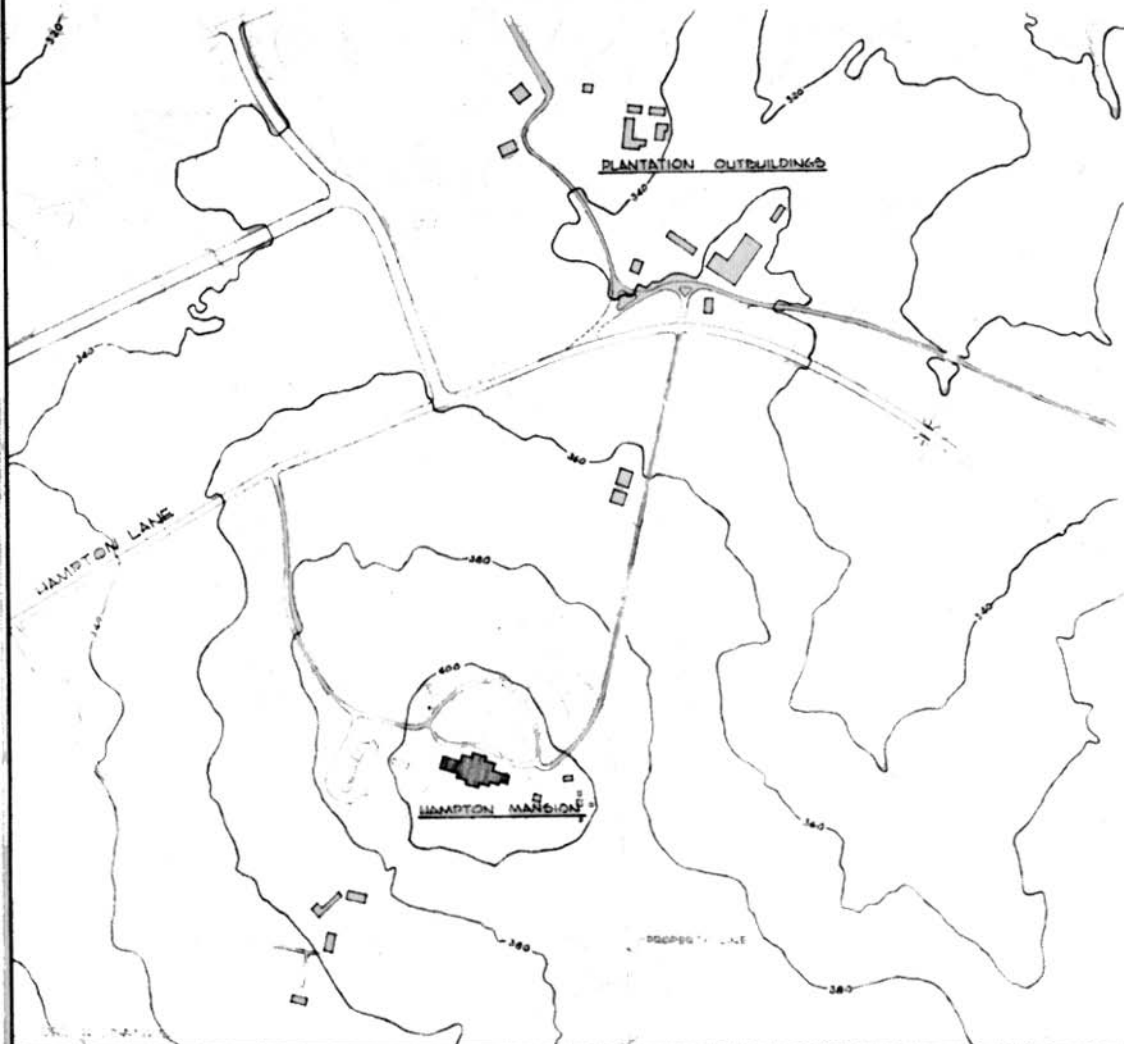


HAMPTON MANSION

HAMPTON NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE BALTIMORE COUNTY MARYLAND



ONE OF THE LARGEST IN POST-REVOLUTIONARY AMERICA, THIS MANSION WAS THE DOMINANT FEATURE OF THE GREAT IRON MANUFACTURING ESTABLISHMENT OF CAPTAIN CHARLES RIDGELY. IT WAS BUILT (AND PROBABLY DESIGNED BY) JEHU HOWELL IN 1783-1790. THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE ACQUIRED PART OF THE PROPERTY IN 1948 AND PARTIALLY RESTORED THE MANSION AT THAT TIME.
