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In accordance with regulations and the delegated authority provided in Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations ("36 CFR"), Chapter 1, Parts 1-7, authorized by Title 16 United States Code, Section 3, the following regulatory provisions are established for the proper management, protection, government and public use of those portions of <u>War In The Pacific National Historical Park</u> under the jurisdiction of the National Park Service. Unless otherwise stated, these regulatory provisions apply in addition to the requirements contained in 36 CFR, Chapter 1, Parts 1-7.

I. <u>36 CFR §1.5 – VISITING HOURS, PUBLIC USE LIMITS, CLOSURES, AND AREA</u> DESIGNATIONS FOR SPECIFIC USE OR ACTIVITIES

(a)(1) The following visiting hours and public use limits are established for all or for the listed portions of the park, and the following closures are established for all or a portion of the park to all public use or to a certain use or activity:

Visiting Hours:

War In The Pacific National Historical Park **IS** open 24-hours-a-day, with the following exceptions:

- Any areas in the Park which are **TEMPORARILY** closed by Superintendent's Order during an emergency per 36 CFR 1.5
- Beach Lower Lot Parking of the Asan Beach Unit IS open to motorized vehicles from 7 am to 3 pm but IS open to pedestrian traffic 24-hours-a-day
- The Ga'an Point Restrooms ARE open from 8 am to 3 pm
- The Asan Beach Unit Restrooms **ARE** open from 7 am to 3 pm
- The Asan Bay Overlook **IS** open to motorized vehicles from 8 am to 3 pm but **IS** open to pedestrian traffic 24-hours-a-day
- Park offices ARE open 7 am to 3:30 pm
- The Agat Unit Restrooms ARE closed at this time

Public Use Limits:

- In "developed areas," a Special Use Permit **IS** required for an event with over 25 people participating
- In "developed areas," organized, commercial tour groups do **NOT** require a Special Use Permit
- In "undeveloped areas," organized, commercial groups **WILL** require a Special Use Permit

Closures:

- <u>Road Closures For Motor Vehicles</u>: The following roads within the Park ARE open to public use although restrictive times may be imposed at times. All other roads including unpaved and service roads are CLOSED to the public for motor vehicle use
 - Marine Corps Drive, Highway #1, in its entirety, throughout the Park
 - Backroad to Piti Guns Unit
 - Mt. Tenjo / Chachao road (this is **NOT** to be confused with the unpaved "old jeep road," which is **CLOSED**)
 - Paved access roads leading to:
 - Asan Bay Overlook Parking Lot
 - Asan Beach Parking Lot
 - Ga'an Point Parking Lot
 - Apaca Point Parking Lot
 - Ronald Wilson Lane / Park Offices
 - o Fonte Plateau Unit

All roads and parking lots within the Park are subject to emergency closure without notice during periods of serious storm and / or wind events.

- <u>Trail Closures For Motorized Scooters</u>: All trails in the Park are **CLOSED** to travel by motorized scooters, skateboards, etc.
- <u>Trail Closures For Bicycles</u>: All paved / unpaved maintained trails within the Park **ARE** open to bicycle traffic, except the following:
 - Piti Gun Trail

(a)(2) The following areas have been designated for a specific use or activity, under the conditions and/or restrictions as noted:

The following restrictions and/or conditions are in effect for specific uses or activities noted:

• <u>Busses at all areas in the Park</u>: Busses **WILL** shut down their engines when not underway. This allows for three minutes idling during shut-down and start up. *"The idling of bus engines adds unnecessary exhaust fumes to the air and diminishes the enjoyment by visitors of the peace and tranquility of the park."* Territory EPA Clean Air Requirement

(a)(3) The following restrictions, limits, closures, designations, conditions, or visiting hour restrictions imposed under §§(a)(1) or (2) have been terminated:

• There are **NO** restrictions at this time

II. <u>36 CFR §1.6 – ACTIVITIES THAT REQUIRE A PERMIT</u>

- Permits **WILL** be obtained at Park Headquarters through the Superintendent's Office.
- Permits **MAY** be arranged for by telephone, fax, or through the U. S. Mail. The permit tee or designee **WILL** pick up the permit in person at the Park.
- The person physically obtaining the permit **WILL** accompany any other person(s) listed on that permit while scientifically collecting in the Park.
- Only those persons listed on the permit are authorized to collect natural products under its terms.

(f) The following is a compilation of those activities for which a permit from the superintendent is required:

- §1.5(d) The following activities related to <u>Public Use Limits</u>:
 - In "developed areas," a Special Use Permit **IS** required for an event with over 25 people participating at one time
 - In "developed areas," organized, commercial tour groups do NOT require a Special Use Permit at this time
 - In "undeveloped areas," organized, commercial groups WILL require a Special Use Permit
 - Camping in the Park is **PROHIBITED**
- §2.1(c)(1) Removal of native plants for "traditional" and non-commercial use, including:
 - All flowers and leaves from all native plants
- §2.19(c)(1)(2) Removal of alien plants for non-commercial use, including:

The following are introduced and may be removed from the Park for non-commercial use

- Bread fruit
 - (Artocarpus <u>sp</u>) (Mangifera <u>sp</u>)
- Mango fruitCoconut fruit
 - (Cocos <u>nucifera</u>)
- Coconut leaves (Cocos nucifera)
 - Iba tree fruit (Thyllantus acidus)
- Banana fruit
 - (Musa <u>sp</u>)
 - Papaya fruit (Carica <u>sp</u>)
 - Hibiscus flowers (Hibiscus <u>sp</u>)
- Orchids
- ()

Coconuts and other fruits may **NOT** be taken by safely throwing objects, or by climbing on walls or structures possessing cultural and/or historical significance.

- §2.4(d) Carry or possess a weapon, trap, or net:
 - At this time the Park does **NOT** require a permit for commercial or personal fishing, octopus, and/or collection of other miscellaneous sea and tidal life due to a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Government of Guam. All such activities must comply with rules and regulations of the Government of Guam.
- §2.5(a) Specimen Collection (Take any plant, fish, wildlife (insects, crustaceans, etc), rocks or minerals, etc. for scientific purposes):
 - Specimen collection of anything from the Park is **PROHIBITED**, without a permit

• §2.12 Audio Disturbances:(a)(3):

- Operation of any type of portable motor or engine, or device powered by a portable motor or engine is **PROHIBITED**
- Operation of a public address system in connection with a public gathering or special event for which a permit has been issued pursuant to §2.50 or §2.51,
 IS permitted
- This does **NOT** preclude using portable motors or engines in conjunction with routine Park or Government of Guam operations
- §2.17 Aircraft & Air Delivery:
 - (a)(3) Delivery or retrieval of a person or object by parachute, helicopter or other airborne means
 - Use of aircraft and helicopters for events other than static displays is **NOT** permitted in the Park, except in an emergency
 - Static displays of aircraft and helicopters ARE permitted. Operations WILL always be done in a safe manner, assisted by personnel knowledgeable in this process, and WILL comply with all relevant aviation rules and regulations
 - The use of parachutes IS allowed with a Special Use Permit

• §2.23(b) The following special recreation activities (per 36 CFR Part 71):

 There are NO special recreation activities requiring a Park permit, other than what may be covered in §2.50(a)

§2.35(a)(3)(i)(A) Possession and/or Consumption of alcoholic beverages in public buildings:

Consumption of alcohol within all government buildings is **PROHIBITED**

• §2.37 Soliciting or demanding gifts, money goods or services (Pursuant to the terms and conditions of a permit issued under §2.50, §2.51 or §2.52):

- All commercial soliciting or demanding of gifts, money goods or services is **PROHIBITED** in the Park
- Soliciting or demanding of gifts, money goods or services **IS** permitted in the Park by "non-profit" groups, so long as the group's purpose is compatible with the purpose of the Park and/or National Park Service

• §2.38 Explosives:

(a) The use of explosives within the Park is PROHIBITED except by the written permission of the Superintendent:

• The use of such explosives **WILL** fall under the proper Federal and Territory, regulations, laws, and standards

- **NOTHING** in this section shall preclude the emergency disposal of live or suspected live ordnance, which may be found within the Park
- **NOTHING** in this section shall preclude the use of explosives in conjunction with official business of the Park or Government of Guam

(b) Use or possess fireworks:

• The use of fireworks in the Park is **PROHIBITED**

• §2.50(a) Conduct a sports event, pageant, regatta, public spectator attraction, entertainment, ceremony, and similar events:

- Organized / sponsored sports in the Park are **PROHIBITED**
- In "developed areas," a Special Use Permit **IS** required for an event with over 25 people participating at one time

• §2.51(a) Public assemblies, meetings, gatherings, demonstrations, parades and other public expressions of views:

• In "developed areas," a Special Use Permit **IS** required for an event with over 25 people participating at one time

The following area is designated for public assemblies and/ or meetings pursuant to First Amendment Rights of the Constitution: (See Map A)

- The terminal (final) 100 feet of the north end of the Asan Beach Parking Lot
- Distribution and sale of printed matter in conjunction with this Constitutional exercise of free speech WILL be confined to the above described area only (See Map A)
- All printed notices that are posted within the Park **WILL** have prior written approval from the Superintendent. The written approval will designate the location(s), duration, removal, and clean-up procedures.
- Political signs used in conjunction with a "Free Speech" event IS permitted so long as the sign(s) is removed immediately after the end of the event

• §2.52(c) Sale or distribution of printed matter that is not solely commercial advertising:

• Distribution and sale of printed matter in conjunction with the Constitutional exercise of free speech **WILL** be confined to the area described on Map A

• §2.60(b) Livestock use:

- The use of livestock in the Park is **PROHIBITED**
- §2.61(a) Residing on federal lands:
 - Residing on federal lands within the Park is **PROHIBITED**

• §2.62 Memorialization:

(a) Erection of monuments (Requires approval from Regional Director)

(b) Scattering ashes from human cremation

- Scattering human ashes from lawful cremation **WILL** require a written permit and so long as the ashes are scattered in or along the ocean's edge
- Scattering of human ashes on playing fields or other open Park areas is **PROHIBITED**
- Burying cremation urns and/or ashes without urns in the Park is **PROHIBITED**

• §3.3 Use of a vessel:

 There are NO restrictions on the use of a vessel in the Park except as noted in §2.2(2) Wildlife Protection, §3.20(a) Water Skiing, and §3.24(b) Personal Watercraft

• §4.11(a) Exceeding of established vehicle load, weight and size limits:

 Vehicles which exceed load, weight and size limits as established by Federal and/or Government of Guam rules and regulations are **PROHIBITED** within the Park unless being used for Park or Government of Guam business

• §5.1 Advertisements - (Display, posting or distribution):

• Displaying, posting, or distributing commercial advertisements in the Park is **PROHIBITED**

• §5.2(b) Sale of intoxicants in certain park areas:

- The sale of alcohol / intoxicants in the Park is **PROHBITED**
- §5.3 Engaging in or soliciting any business (Requires a permit, contract or other written agreement with the United States, or must be pursuant to special regulations:
 - Engaging in and/or soliciting of any business in the Park is **PROHIBITED**
 - Conducting business with the Park **IS** permitted

• §5.5 Commercial Photography/Filming:

- (a) Commercial filming of motion pictures or television involving the use of professional casts, settings or crews, other than bona fide newsreel or news television
 - Commercial filming of motion pictures or television in the Park WILL require a permit

- (b) Still photography of vehicles, or other articles of commerce or models for the purpose of commercial advertising
 - Commercial still photography in the Park WILL require a permit
- §5.6(c) Use of commercial vehicles on park area roads (The superintendent shall issue a permit to access private lands within or adjacent to the park when access is otherwise not available):
 - Tour vehicles **WILL** be permitted on Park roads
 - Fuel trucks and/or vehicles carrying hazardous materials are **PROHIBITED** on any beach in the Park
 - Fuel trucks and/or vehicles carrying hazardous materials **ARE** permitted in the Asan and Ga'an Beach Unit Parking Lots
- §5.7 Construction of buildings, facilities, trails, roads, boat docks, structures, etc.:
 - Constructing buildings, facilities, trails, roads, boat docks, structures, etc. in the Park, except that for official Park operations, is **PROHIBITED**
- Part 7 Special Regulations:
 - There are **NO** CFR Part 7 Special Regulations for War In The Pacific National Historical Park

III. GENERAL REGULATIONS

<u>36 CFR §2.1 – PRESERVATION OF NATURAL, CULTURAL AND ARCHEOLOGICAL</u> RESOURCES

(a)(4) Dead wood on the ground may be collected for use as fuel for campfires within the park in the following areas:

- Collecting dead wood is **PROHIBITED** (ground fires in the Park are **PROHIBITED**)
- Collecting any wood other than driftwood is **PROHIBITED** except by permit
- Cutting live or dead trees still standing or down, is **PROHIBITED**
- Driftwood **MAY** be removed from the Park so long as it is being used for private purposes and not being sold commercially

(a)(5) The following conditions are in effect for walking, climbing, entering, ascending or traversing the listed archeological or cultural resource, monuments or statues:

- Ga'an Beach knoll cave and gun emplacement are OPEN for viewing
- Asan Ridge Cave used by Japanese WW-II soldiers, is **CLOSED** due to safety reasons
- Climbing upon and/or molesting artifacts and structures, such as "the torpedo" or guns, is **PROHIBITED** due to their historical significance

Although other tunnels and caves within the Park remain open to the public, <u>extreme caution</u> must be exercised when entering them

(c) Hiking or pedestrian traffic is restricted to the trail tread or walkway on the following trails/walkways:

• Hiking / walking **IS** permitted anywhere in the Park

(c)(1), (c)(2) The following fruits, nuts, berries or unoccupied seashells may be gathered by hand for personal use or consumption, in accordance with the noted size, quantity, collection sites and/or use or consumption restrictions:

- Unoccupied seashells **MAY** be collected from the high tide area so long as they are being used for private purposes and not being sold commercially
- Collecting coral—dead or alive—is **PROHIBITED**
- Driftwood **MAY** be collected from the Park so long as it is being used for private purposes and not being sold commercially
- There are no known fruits, nuts, or berries currently being collected for consumption in the Park at this time. Any such collection **WILL** be for personal consumption
- All such collection **WILL** be by non-mechanical means
- Extreme care must be exercised in the collection of any of the above so as not to damage the host/surrounding resource

(d)(2) Only where specifically authorized by Federal statutory law, treaty rights, or in accordance with §2.2 or §2.3, the taking, use, or possession of the following fish, wildlife or plants for ceremonial or religious purposes is permitted:

As provided by 36 CFR Section 1.6, 36 CFR Section 2.1 (d) "Preservation of Natural Features," "The American Indian Religious Freedom Act, Public Law 95-341," as codified in 42 USC Section 1996; and the National Park Service Policy on Native American Relationships Management, the Superintendent authorizes the collection of the following natural products in the following quantities and under the following circumstances for the express purposes of Public Law 95-341.

<u>THIS SECTION IS BEING RESEARCHED AT THIS TIME</u>

36 CFR §2.2 - WILDLIFE PROTECTION

(2) The feeding, touching, teasing, frightening or intentional disturbing of wildlife nesting, breeding or other activities:

- The Marine Mammal Protection Act **PROHIBITS** boats from approaching within 100 yards of marine mammals including dolphins, which includes "herding" the animals
- The Endangered Species Act PROHIBITS harassment of sea turtles

(3)(b) Hunting and trapping. (1) Hunting shall be allowed in Park areas where such activity is specifically mandated by federal statutory law:

• Hunting, trapping, and harvesting all land animals (including but not limited to deer, pigs, carabao, birds, land crabs, coconut crabs, and bats) in the park is **PROHIBITED**

(2)Hunting may be allowed in park areas where such activity is specifically authorizes as a discretionary activity under Federal Statutory law if the superintendent determines:

• Hunting, trapping, and harvesting all land animals (including but not limited to deer, pigs, carabao, birds, land crabs, coconut crabs, and bats) in the Park is **PROHIBITED**

(d) The transporting of lawfully taken wildlife through the park is permitted under the following conditions and procedures:

• Wildlife, such as deer, pigs, and fish, which is legally taken from outside the boundaries of the Park, **MAY** be transported through the Park in an expeditious manner. This will usually entail the hunter or fisherman transiting the park via Marine Corps Drive. Those doing this transporting will need any and all supporting documentation required of the Government of Guam, such as hunting permits, animal tags, licenses, etc.

(e) The following areas are closed to the viewing of wildlife with the use of an artificial light:

• There are **NO** restrictions at this time

<u>36 CFR §2.3 – FISHING</u>

(a) State fishing law and/or regulation do not apply in the following areas:

The Government of Guam solely manages all fishing in and around the island. In the Park, fishing is generally for subsistence and traditional use for personal consumption (See Map B)

- 1. Asan Beach Unit: There are three politically separate areas / entities offshore or submerged
 - Both the area belonging to the Federal Government (exclusive of the Marine Protected Area) and the area belonging to the Government of Guam, **DO** permit traditional subsistence fishing for personal consumption in according with the Territorial laws and regulations
 - Fishing in any form in the Marine Protected Area in the Park west of the pipeline, is **PROHIBITED**
- 2. Ga'an Beach Unit: There are two politically separate / entities offshore
 - Both the area belonging to the Federal Government and the area belonging to the Government of Guam, **DO** permit traditional subsistence fishing for personal consumption in accordance with the Territorial laws and regulations

(d)(2) Possession or use of live or dead minnows or other bait fish, amphibian, non-preserved fish eggs or roe is permitted in the following fresh water areas:

• The possession / use of live or dead minnows or other bait fish, amphibian, non-preserved eggs or roe **WILL** comply with the Government of Guam

(d)(4) In accordance with federal statutory law, commercial fishing is authorized in the following areas, under the conditions noted:

• Commercial fishing in the Park is **PROHIBITED**, per a Memorandum of Understanding between the Park and the Government of Guam

(d)(8) Fishing is permitted within 200 feet of the following swimming beaches, surfing areas, public boat docks, motor road bridges, and water sport rafts or floats:

 There are NO designated swimming beaches, surfing areas, public boat docks, etc., so fishing IS permitted anywhere EXCEPT in the Marine Protection Area, where it is PROHIBITED (See Map B) (e) Fishing in salt waters with net, spear or weapon, (not in compliance with state law) are authorized in the following areas only:

• Fishing within the Marine Protection Area is **PROHIBITED** (See Map B)

36 CFR §2.4 - WEAPONS, TRAPS, AND NETS

(a)(1); (a)(2)(i) Weapons, traps, or nets may only be carried, possessed or used as provided for in parts 7 and 13; and at the following designated times and locations where the taking of wildlife is authorized by 2.2 or the taking of fish is authorized by 2.3:

• Possessing and using any weapon, trap, and/or net within the Park except as authorized by the Territory, for the taking of fish and other wildlife from the water is **PROHIBITED**

(2)(ii) or as designated pursuant to special regulations, for target practice during the following times and at the following facilities or locations:

• Target practice with weapons in the Park is **PROHIBITED**

36 CFR §2.11 - PICNICKING

Areas Closed to Picnicking:

• All areas of the Park are **OPEN** to picnicking

Conditions for Picnicking:

- Picnics involving groups of 25 or more people WILL require a permit
- Trash and related cleanup **WILL** be performed by picnickers

<u> 36 CFR 2.13 – FIRES</u>

(a)(1) The lighting or maintaining of fires is generally prohibited, except as provided for in the following designated areas and/or receptacles, and under the conditions noted:

Designated Areas:

- Fires on the ground ("camp fires") in the Park are **PROHIBITED**
- Fires using wood, briquette, gasoline, and propane-type fuels **ARE** permitted
- Fires used for Park and/or Government of Guam maintenance and "cleanup" activities ARE permitted

Receptacles Allowed:

• Fires in receptacles in the Park **ARE** permitted

Established Conditions for Fires:

• Fires created / utilized by Park staff for official purposes **WILL** be in accordance with Territory and Federal air quality regulation and law, as well as any limits and conditions on open fires as ordered by the Government of Guam

(a)(2) The following restrictions are in effect for the use of stoves or lanterns:

- Stoves **ARE** permitted in the Park
- Lanterns **ARE** permitted in areas of the Park which are open to the public after dark

(b) Fires must be extinguished according to the following conditions:

- Leaving fires unattended in the Park is **PROHIBITED**
- All fires in the Park **WILL** be extinguished when no longer being used

(c) High fire danger closures will be in effect as noted:

• The Park and/ or its users **WILL** adhere to any and all "High Fire Danger" warnings and restrictions as issued by the Government of Guam

36 CFR §2.14 – SANITATION and REFUSE

(a)(2) The use of government refuse receptacles or facilities for dumping household, commercial or industrial refuse, brought as such from private or municipal property may be allowed under the following conditions:

• Dumping household, commercial or industrial refuse in Park receptacles is **PROHIBITED**

(c)Conditions for the disposal, containerization, or carryout of human body waste have been established for the following:

• Disposing of human waste in the Park, other than in restrooms, is **PROHIBITED**

<u>36 CFR §2.15 – PETS</u>

(a)(1) The following structures and/or areas are closed to the possession of pets:

- All government buildings, restrooms, and related structures are **CLOSED** to pets
- All caves and related historical structures and objects are **CLOSED** to pets
- All pets **WILL** be under physical restraint

(a)(3) Pets may be left tied to an object under the following conditions:

• Tying pets to any object under any circumstance in the Park is **PROHIBITED**

(a)(5) Pet excrement must be disposed of in accordance with the following conditions:

• Pet excrement WILL be removed from the Park by the pet owners

(b) Where hunting is allowed, the following conditions apply for use of dogs for support of such activity in accordance with Federal and State laws:

• Hunting, trapping, and harvesting all land animals (including but not limited to deer, pigs, carabao, birds, land crabs, coconut crabs, and bats) in the Park is **PROHIBITED**

36 CFR §2.17 – AIRCRAFT and AIR DELIVERY

(a)(1) The following areas have been designated pursuant to special regulations for operating or using aircraft:

- Landing of aircraft, helicopters, or by parachute is **PROHIBITED** except by permit
- Static displays of aircraft, helicopters, and parachutes WILL be allowed by permit
- Nothing in this section will preclude using the Park during an emergency incident

36 CFR §2.20 – SKATING, SKATEBOARDS and SIMILAR DEVICES

The use of roller skates, skateboards, roller skis, coasting vehicles, or similar devices are NOT allowed in the following areas:

- Asan Bay Overlook
- Liberator's Memorial
- Piti Guns Unit

<u>36 CFR §2.21 – SMOKING</u>

(a) The following portions of the park, or all or portions of buildings, structures or facilities are closed to smoking:

• Smoking in government buildings, restrooms, and vehicles in the Park is **PROHIBITED**

<u>36 CFR §2.22 – PROPERTY</u>

(a)(2) The following describes areas where property may be left unattended for periods longer than 24 hours, and/or the conditions under which property may be left:

- Geo-caching in the Park is **PROHIBITED**. All geo-caches will be considered unattended and abandoned property and will be removed
- There are **NO** areas where property may be left unattended for longer than 24 hours
- This section does **NOT** preclude a vehicle or trailer from being left when unable to be moved due to mechanical problems and which are being actively repaired

36 CFR §2.23 – RECREATION FEES

(b) Recreation fees, and/or a permit, in accordance with 36 CFR part 71, are established for the following entrance fee areas, and/or for the use of the following specialized sites, facilities, equipment or services, or for participation in the following group activity, recreation events or specialized recreation uses:

Entrance Fee Areas:

• There are **NO** Park Entrance Fees at this time

Daily Site Use Fee Areas:

• There are **NO** Daily Site Use Fees at this time

Special Recreation Permit Fee (Such as but not limited to, group activities, recreation events, and the use of motorized recreation vehicles):

- There are **NO** Special Recreation Permit Fees at this time
- There are **NO** Special Use Permit Fees at this time

36 CFR §2.35 – ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES and CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

(a)(3)(i) The following public use areas, portions of public use areas, and/or public facilities within the park are closed to consumption of alcoholic beverages, and/or to the possession of a bottle, can or other receptacle containing an alcoholic beverage that is open, or has been opened, or whose seal has been broken or the contents of which have been partially removed:

• Consuming alcohol in government buildings or vehicles is **PROHIBITED**

<u>36 CFR §2.38 – EXPLOSIVE</u>

(b) Fireworks and firecrackers may be possessed and/or used in the following areas, under the conditions noted:

- The use of explosives within the Park is **PROHIBITED**
- The use of fireworks within the Park is **PROHIBITED**
- Nothing in this section shall preclude the emergency disposal of suspected live ordnance
- Explosives MAY be used for Park operations

36 CFR §2.62 – MEMORIALIZATION

(c) A permit is required for the scattering of ashes from cremated human remains, or in the following designated areas without a permit, and/or according to the following conditions:

- Scattering of human ashes from lawful cremation WILL require a permit
- Human ashes will **ONLY** be dispersed in or along the ocean's edge
- Scattering of human ashes in or around historical objects, playing fields and/or other open areas of the Park is **PROHIBITED**
- Remains to be scattered **WILL** have been cremated and pulverized
- Scattering **WILL** take place in such a manner and in such a location that the ashes will not be located and identified as human remains
- Burying cremation urns and/or ashes without urns in the Park is **PROHIBITED**
- Leaving memorials, plaques, photos, or cremation urns in the Park is **PROHIBITED**
- Constructing "roadside" crosses or similar structures in the Park is **PROHIBITED**
- Those individuals scattering ashes **WILL** recognize and **BE** aware of the sensitivity of this activity and agree to perform it in a discreet and private manner
- All local, Territory, and Federal rules and regulations **WILL** be followed

<u>36 CFR §3.3 – VESSEL PERMITS</u>

• Permits are **NOT** required for the use of a vessel within Park waters

<u>36 CFR §3.6 – BOATING OPERATIONS</u>

(d)(1) Vessels may not create a wake or exceed 5 mph in the following areas:

- There are **NO** restrictions at this time
- (e) Operating a vessel not propelled by hand within 500 feet of a designated swimming beach:
 - There are **NO** areas designated as swimming beaches

(h) The following sites are designated for the launching or recovery of vessels using a trailer:

• There are **NO** areas within the Park designated for the launching or recovery of vessels using a trailer

(i) The following areas/sites are designated for the launching or recovery of vessels propelled by machinery:

• There are **NO** restrictions at this time

(I) Vessels must meet the following size, length or width restrictions:

• There are **NO** restrictions at this time

36 CFR §3.20 – WATER SKIING

(a) The towing of persons by vessels is permitted in the following areas under the terms and conditions noted:

• Towing of persons on the "reef flat" in the Park is **PROHIBITED**. The reef flat is the shallow area near shore, inside of the reef crest as defined by breaker waves

36 CFR §3.21 – SWIMMING AND BATHING

(a)(1) The following areas are closed to swimming and bathing:

• There are **NO** restrictions at this time

(a)(2) The following restrictions apply to all swimming and bathing activities:

• There are **NO** restrictions at this time

**Caution should be exercised when swimming in the Asan River due to unpredictable currents

(b) The use of floatation devices, glass containers, kites, or incompatible sporting activities is not permitted on the following swimming beaches:

• There are **NO** restrictions at this time

36 CFR §3.23 – SCUBA AND SNORKELING

(a) SCUBA diving and snorkeling is permitted in the following swimming, docking, and mooring areas under the terms and conditions noted:

• There are **NO** restrictions at this time

36 CFR §3.24 – PERSONAL WATERCRAFT (PWC)

- (b) PWC use is permitted in the following areas under the terms and conditions noted:
 - Personal Water Craft use in the Park is **PROHIBITED**

36 CFR §4.10 – TRAVEL ON PARK ROADS AND ROUTES

(a) Park roads, open for travel by motor vehicle are those indicated below, and/or as indicated in the following publication or document:

The following roads within the Park are **OPEN** to public use although restrictive times may be imposed when necessary. All other roads including unpaved and service roads are **CLOSED** to the public for motor vehicle use

- Marine Corps Drive, Highway #1, in its entirety, throughout the park
- Backroad to Piti Guns Unit
- Mt. Tenjo / Chachao road (this is NOT to be confused with the unpaved "old jeep road," which is CLOSED
- Paved access roads leading to:
 - Asan Bay Overlook Parking Lot
 - Asan Beach Parking Lot
 - Ga'an Point Parking Lot
 - Apaca Point Parking Lot
 - Ronald Wilson Lane / Park Offices
 - Fonte Plateau Unit

(b) The following routes and/or areas, designated pursuant to special regulations, are open for off-road vehicle travel under the terms and conditions noted:

• There are **NO** roads open strictly for off-road vehicle travel

(c)(1) Track-laying motor vehicles, or other motor vehicles equipped with a similar traction device may be operated on the following routes under the terms and conditions noted:

• There are **NO** roads open strictly for track-laying vehicles, or other motor vehicles equipped with a similar traction device

<u> 36 CFR §4.11 – VEHICLE LOAD, WEIGHT AND SIZE LIMITS</u>

(a) The following load, weight and size limits, which are more restrictive than State law, apply to the roads indicated under the terms and conditions, and/or under permit as noted:

• There are NO restrictions at this time

<u>36 CFR §4.21 – SPEED LIMITS</u>

(b) The following speed limits are established for the routes/roads indicated:

- Marine Corps Drive, Highway #1, in its entirety through the Park is adjudicated by the Government of Guam and is currently posted for 35 mph
- All other paved and unpaved roads within the Park are 15 mph, unless otherwise posted

<u>36 CFR §4.30 – BICYCLES</u>

(a) Bicycle use is permitted on park roads / parking areas with the exception of the following:

All paved/unpaved roads and trails within the Park **ARE** open to bicycle traffic, except the following:

• Piti Gun Trail

The following additional routes have been designated for bicycle use:

• There are NO additional routes designated for bicycle use at this time

(d)(3) Riding a bicycle abreast of another rider is permitted on the following routes, under the conditions noted:

- Riding of bicycles abreast of another rider is permitted on:
 - Marine Corps Drive
 - Any paved or unpaved road where bicycling is permitted

<u> 36 CFR §4.31 – HITCHHIKING</u>

Hitchhiking is permitted in the following areas under the terms and conditions noted:

• There are **NO** restrictions at this time
