# **Pinnacles Field Trip Expectations and Information**

Pinnacles National Park is an exciting way for you to experience natural phenomena in one of our nation's National Parks! Below are important guidelines for having a successful field trip to Pinnacles National Park.

#### Expectations:

- Stay with your teacher/chaperone AT ALL TIMES.
- Stay ON the designated trails. This will minimize your risk of getting hurt and protect the national park's resources.
- ALWAYS follow the directions of your teacher or chaperone.
- If you see a wild animal, DO NOT attempt to touch or feed them.
- Alert an adult if you see a plant or animal that may be poisonous or unsafe.
- Wear proper clothing for hiking and weather conditions on that day. Weather can change rapidly!
- Keep your voices down- talking is fine, but avoid screaming or yelling unless you are in danger.
- Alert an adult immediately if you or someone else gets injured or hurt.

### Important Information:

- **DO NOT REMOVE ANYTHING FROM THE PARK!** Pinnacles is a National Park- this means it is a *Federal Offense* to take, remove, or damage any of the resources at the park- This includes rocks, plants, pinecones, flowers, animals, etc.
- There is NO cell service or WiFi available at the park, so your cell phones will not work.
  - You are welcome to take pictures or videos though!
  - $\circ~$  We will have access to emergency GPS and radios if something happens.
- Pinnacles National Park does have some poisonous plants and animals to look out for- these include, poison oak, ticks, and (rarely) rattlesnakes- it is imperative that you wear protective clothing and *ALWAYS* stay on the designated trails to minimize your risk of getting injured.
- You will be getting a free lunch from the cafeteria on the morning of your field trip, but you are welcome to bring extra snacks for the bus and hike!
- Please bring a reusable water bottle... let me know ASAP if you do not have one- this will be mandatory for the hike!
- Clean up ALL TRASH at the Park AND on the Bus.

# Itinerary for Pinnacles Field Trip on \_\_\_\_\_

- **7:40-8:55 AM-** Arrive at school. Get your free bag lunch at the cafeteria.
- **7:55- 8:00 AM** Meet in the MPR. We will check to ensure you are wearing proper clothing and you have all the necessary items for the field trip.
- 8:00AM- 8:10AM- Board the bus!
- 9:30-9:45 AM- Arrive Pinnacles National Park (EAST Entrance). Park at Bear Gulch Day Use Area.
  - $\circ$   $\;$  There are bathrooms, water, a picnic area, and a visitor center.
- **9:45-10:00 AM** Begin Hike! Complete journaling activities during the hike.
  - The projected hike will be approximately *2 miles with 500 feet of elevation gain*. We plan to go from Bear Gulch Day Use Area- Moses Springs Trail- Bear Gulch Reservoir- Rim Trail- back to Bear Gulch. We may explore the caves a bit if time permits and they are open.
- 12:00-12:10 PM- Finish Hike. Meet at Bear Gulch Picnic Area.
- 12:10-12:40 PM- Lunch and discuss what we saw/ experienced on the hike!
  - $\circ$   $\,$  Now is the time to use bathrooms, take care of personal needs before we get back on the bus.
- **12:45 PM** Board the Bus and leave Pinnacles to go back to HMS.
- 2:20- 2:40 PM- Arrive back at Harden. We will wait in the MPR for classes to end, then HOME!

## Clothing/Attire:

You will be allowed "free dress" on the day of your field trip, but you must follow the guidelines!

### \*If you are not wearing proper clothing/attire, you will not be allowed on the bus! NO RED OR BLUE!\*

- **Close-toed shoes-** like tennis shoes, running/athletic shoes/ sneakers. NO sandals, open toes, or Crocs! Hiking shoes with good tread on the bottom are best, but any closed-toe sneaker is fine.
- **PANTS-** should be comfortable, shorts are NOT recommended because you need to protect your legs from poison oak and ticks! Jeans are ok.
- Layering for your top- T-shirt, long sleeve shirt or sweatshirt, and rain or wind jacket.
- Hat, sunglasses, sunscreen- It can get HOT at Pinnacles- protect yourself from the sun!
- Small backpack or bag- to carry water, snacks, journal, pencil, and monocular during the hike.
- Water Bottle- You must bring at LEAST 1 liter of water for the hike- water will be available to refill.

\*You will not need to bring your regular school supplies since we will be visiting Pinnacles the entire school day. Make sure you bring a bag or backpack to carry the required materials/supplies during the hike!
